VOLUNTEERISM

When Fr Michael J. McGivney founded The Knights of Columbus in 1882 (125 years ago) he depended upon men you were volunteers from St. May's Parish in New Haven to get the organization started. He envisioned an order of Catholic men, strong in their faith, who would band together to be of service to their church and service to the community in which they live -- and who would participate in action programs to make a positive difference in the lives of people in their parishes and neighborhoods.

Fast forwarding to today, one only has to look to the Knights in Action section and the photo finish page at the back of the Columbia magazine to see how knights are continuing to volunteer in their churches and in their communities.

Over the years a number of 4731 Knights have volunteered at food banks and hunger centers, hospitals, meals on wheels, theater and cultural venues, museums and civic entities etc. A segment of our retired Knights carry on this tradition but their numbers are dwindling. Every parish that we serve during this past fall has run parish bulletin request for various liturgical ministries, coaches, PSR or CCD teachers, And youth ministries. Also many community agencies are actively seeking volunteers. Meals on Wheels is posting flyers pleading for help; all the hospitals have produced brochures on what volunteering involves, the senior citizen centers want volunteers and so on.

There exists private organizations that search for volunteers like RSVP (Retired + Seniors Volunteer Programs) BVU (Business Volunteers Unlimited) and SCORE (Service Corps of Retired Executives).

As part of rededicating North Olmsted Council to a planned program of volunteering which has been submitted to our officers and approved, we are compiling a library of agencies needing volunteers, their contact people, brochures and information. Wouldn't it be great if 3 to 5 Knights would form a team at Meals on Wheels? Or 3 to 10 other Knight to form teams to volunteer at Fairview Hospital or St. John's west shore or the Cleveland Clinic? Or even a larger group once a month at the Cleveland Food Bank?
