Volunteers were needed to help at the Brecksville Christmas Gift Shop November 29th or 30th, December 1st or 2^{nd.} For their help they received a free lunch at the hospital cafeteria. Prior to the event, letters were sent out to all the Northeastern Ohio Councils and Assemblies inviting them to consider donating their time or money. Many wives joined their husbands as volunteers. Volunteers also included members of local parishes, and the VFW.

Total 64 volunteers came from Knights of Columbus Councils or Assemblies.

Volunteers from the Knights of Columbus came from 14 Councils or Assemblies on Nov 29th through Dec 2nd. 15 Councils and 9 Assemblies sent in contributions. Why Join the Knights of Columbus?

Over the years, many people have asked me "Why should I join the Knights of Columbus?" While the answer varies from person to person, this is what I tell them led me to join the Knights. The Knights of Columbus was founded by a humble parish priest, Fr. Michael J. McGivney in 1882 in the community of New Haven, Connecticut. The idea of starting the K of C was to provide a practical way of joining Catholic men together in service to their church, community, families, youth, and each other. It also provided a forum, through which those same men could support each other emotionally creating a fraternal bond to get through hard times. Fr. McGivney's idea was to have a council in every parish; building a unified support base from which those men could take care of their own families and those of their fellow parishioners. So, how does that apply to today? Why should a Catholic man join the Knights of Columbus in 2010? The answer today is similar to the reason the K of C was started over 128 years ago: membership helps us to build a fraternal base of support for each other as well as to witness our Catholic Faith in a real and practical way. We live in a "me" oriented society. We lead hectic lives that do not tend to foster connectedness with others. We scurry from place to place working, transporting our children from activity to activity and seldom stop to re-energize and take care of ourselves. This life style promotes disconnection, increased stress and a decreased enjoyment with life. The Knights of Columbus is a Catholic Family-Oriented Organization focused on providing a faith-based foundation from which to witness true Christianity and build a meaningful life. Membership in the Knights of Columbus provides members with:

• <u>A Sense of Belonging</u>. – Members have the opportunity to work, play and pray with other members and their families, providing a deeper sense of community than mere residence in the same neighborhood. They are also joined spiritually in remembrance at daily mass celebrated by Our Supreme Chaplain, and are welcomed at any council event conducted throughout the country.

• <u>A Sense of Accomplishment.</u> - Working with brother knights on local service projects provides members with a sense of self-esteem and joy that comes from giving to those in need. Every year over 140 million man-hours of volunteer service are donated by members of the Order to "make a difference" in their local communities.

• <u>A Sense of Unity.</u> – Members soon become aware of how much fraternal relationships can add to their life by engaging in the planning and conducting of council service projects and council social events; helping them to "feel a connection" with others in their community. They also come to realize how much more they can accomplish working together than they ever could on their own.

• <u>A Sense of Pride.</u> - Being a part of an International Organization of 1.8 Million Catholic Men focused on making a positive difference in the world provides members with a meaningful connected-ness and a sense of fraternal support missing in the lives of most men in today's society.

• <u>A Sense of Righteousness</u>. Councils often include their entire family in their activities, realizing that by modeling service to others they are promoting healthy values and a sense of ethics and morality in their children; while establishing a closer, more meaningful relationship with them.

Joining the Knights of Columbus is an opportunity to become a part of Fr. McGivney's Dream to unite Catholic men in action; in service to their church, their community, their family, their children and each other. 
