I am sure that their goal will be similar to mine since I came to North Olmsted Council 3 years ago: to increase Council membership in all of our 3 core North Olmsted parishes and to improve, as well, the K. of C. presence in the other Western Suburban parishes from which our Council draws some of its present, and expectedly future Knights.

<u>DURING OUR BUSY SPRING</u>, 11 new members joined our Council. When you see them at a K. of C. meeting or event, introduce yourself and give them a hearty welcome!

On Wednesday, March 12th in the Terrace Room, Our North Olmsted First Degree Team conferred 1st Degrees on <u>EDWARD CHAVEZ, JR</u>., son of Eddie Chavez, Sr.; <u>JOHN R.</u> <u>CRANE</u>, of St. Clarence, sponsored by Jim Buckley; and <u>JAMES SOLTIS</u> of St. Richard, proposed by Paul Mathieson.

JOHN CRANE and JAMES SOLTIS proceeded to Garfield Council on Mar. 25th, along with <u>KEVIN AMBURGY</u>, sponsored by Don Lloyd to observe <u>RYAN GOELLNER</u> from St. Richard, and a graduating senior from St. Ignatius High School, proposed by hid dad, Bill Goellner, make his First Degree. Ryan is the first juvenile insurance member in a long while to turn 18

and rapidly join our Council thereafter. All four men proceeded to complete their Second Degree at Garfield Council later that same evening.

Michael J. McGivney (August 12, 1852), or else Thursday, August 14th, the 118th Anniversary of the death of our Founder, Fr. Michael J. McGivney (August 14, 1890). More details on this and other Degrees will come in future Narrators. <u>MY LAST WRITTEN WORDS</u> on Membership: I really have enjoyed my past 8 years working on K. of C. Membership and I am proud of the results I have helped two Councils accomplish: In my 5 years of Membership work at West Park Council # 2790, an even 100 new members were recruited; during my past 3 years as Membership Director here at North Olmsted Council, I planned, reorganized revitalized and executed a membership program by which 79 new and readmitted members were brought into K. of C. Council # 4731.

It has been personally gratifying to watch and to encourage these new brother Knights to become active, to accompany and support them as they made their subsequent degrees, to observe and to applaud the many who have become officers, committee heads, event chairmen, and simple active Knights doing lots of good works under the Knights of Columbus banner.

I hope through our expenditure of a common effort our Council has become strengthened and is becoming prepared for the future with the new additions to our roster.

I must give special thanks to the countless members who assembled literature packets at meetings, who welcomed men at Mass during parish blitzes and coffee and doughnut Sundays and ministry fairs as we sought new members.

Special praise goes to PGK Jerry Nowesnick who gave presentations at the Open Houses conducted by our council. My personal thanks to Paul Mathieson and Mike Mullins who as new members this year offered to learn the Membership Director's duties and helped out on membership recruitment.

My thanks to PGK Ray Metsch and GK Kevin Sheehan for giving me free reign to do "my" thing in building membership, and to all the officers I worked with.

Finally I am especially indebted to the many member Knights who listened to my nonwavering membership message of one-on-one recruiting: "Ask a Catholic man you know to join the Knights." So many Knights broadcast that message, and asked Catholic men one-on-one and brought them to their first degree.

For example, this current year, so far, nineteen different sponsor/proposers brought in thirty-one new and readmitted members according to local Council records. That is more than double our quota for the prestigious Star Council Award. We will know after June 30th, subject to Supreme Council records, whether #4731 earned the Star or Double Star Award.

Family Activities

1. The 2008 Super Cash Bonanza Charity Campaign was successful again this year. We reached our goal again of over ten tickets per member in our council. We had 266 members at the point that our goal was set by K of C Columbus. So our council sold 2840 tickets. I want to thank every Knight that was able to help buy or sell tickets this year. A special thank you goes out to our CO-Chairmen, Gene Hanzely and Rudy Chavez. They sold 586 and 500 tickets respectively. They didn't sell any refrigerators to the Eskimos this year but they sold a lot of tickets.

Why did we shoot for 10 tickets per man? The ticket Headquarters in Columbus offered enough incentives in the form of rebates again this year, that our council will receive close to \$4.50 back to the council for every ticket that was sold by the council, totaling \$12,780.00. This money will be used by the council and

given to Charities in our community.

We had some small incentives for our Knights that sold more than 15 tickets. Anybody selling 15 or more tickets will receive 1 month dues paid off of next year's dues. Any Knight selling over 20 tickets will receive 2 months and over 30 tickets sold will receive 3 months dues paid. Also Gene Hanzely received a prize of \$50.00 for being the biggest seller. Rudy Chavez received \$30.00 for being the second biggest seller. And Jeff Keeper received a check for \$30.00 for being able to get a group to sell his tickets for him. Nice going all who helped.

Measure Up Campaign 2008

On Thurs., Fri., Sat., & Sun., April 24,25,26,27, our Council began our Annual Measure Up Collection at the N.O. Giant Eagle – Water Tower. 30 Knights & 1 Knight's Lady (Mrs. Peter Frank) covered 33 scheduled hours & totaled 59 man-hours of collecting, we collected a total of \$2680.

On Thurs., Fri., Sat., & Sun., May 1,2,3,4,, we collected at the N.O. WalMart. 48 Knights & 2 Knight's Ladies (Mrs. Peter Frank & Mrs. Dean McKay) covered 36 Scheduled hours totaling 96 man-hours. We also had 2 father/son teams participating – Ryan & Bill Goellner & Rudy & Ignacio Chavez. Despite 2 days of rain & thunderstorms, we collected a total of \$3371.

Although our 2008 total of \$6051 is considerably less than 2007, considering our current economy – especially gasoline prices – and 2 days of rain storms, I feel we did <u>very well</u>, and the residents of N.O. & the surrounding area again displayed their generosity.


FYI:
