FEED THE HUNGRY---Brother Knight Ray Rowe (440-779-9255) is chairing a team effort to involve the Knights with the boy scouts and cub scouts at St. Brendan Parish in collecting food at their Sunday liturgies on November 11th and November 18th. The donated foods then have to be delivered to North Olmsted Food Bank and to the St. Augustine Hunger Center. Give Ray a call and give the Knights an hour or two of your time on this most worthwhile task. When proven successful, we hope to expand this project in 2008 to the other parishes we Knights serve in the Western Suburbs.

FEED THE HUNGRY AND REFRESH THE THIRSTY---Our Chaplain Fr. Joe McNulty has issued a call to the Knights for help at Thanksgiving and Christmas this year. You should know that Father Joe and his helper Sister Corita Ambro supervise the cooking, preparing and serving of between 10,000 and 12,000 meals thru the St. Augustine Hunger Center on Thanksgiving and again at Christmas. It literally takes a small army of volunteers to staff the 10 to 15 outreach centers where the meals are served that feed the needy, the poor and the homeless. A big need is the delivery of meals to the disabled and the homebound-over half of the 12,000 Thanksgiving and Christmas Dinners need to be delivered to the home or apartment bound.

Father Joe has setup a Turkey Hotline at 216-781-5530 that volunteers can call to reserve the choicest jobscooking and food preparation, serving of the meals, and delivery of meals to shut-ins.

Volunteering is open to all members of the family, but Father Joe suggests you call early this month to register. Talk to your family and help fulfill the need. The Thanksgiving and/or Christmas Season you spend with the poor and disadvantaged you and your family will long cherish and vividly remember. Sister Corita says "It seems like organized chaos, but it works, and you'll be blessed for the help that you give to the needy."

Father Joe says that work has already started on the turkey cooking and the turkey carving. Turkey portions are carved, frozen, stored, and heated at the time of the meal. So if you are an expert turkey cooker or turkey carver or just a plain old' TURKEY, call the turkey hotline and volunteer your services.

LOVE THE CHILDREN--- Sunday Dec. 2, 2007 is the 36th K of C St. Augustine kids Christmas Party. Father Joe and Sister Corita operate the Cleveland Diocese Ministry to the Deaf, to the Blind, to the Disabled, and by virtue of the St. Augustine location, a year-round ministry against poverty for the poor. Needed this year are more clowns (talk to Tom Lisy, PGK 440-871-9641) and more youth dressed as elves. Each year we serve 500 to 600 children from toddler to 10 years old. Each youngster gets a present and hot dogs, pop, pizza, ice cream, and cookies for lunch. Doors will open about 12 noon, but folks line up at 10. The Knights attend the 10 A.M. Mass for the Deaf at St. Augustine and proceed to the OLA Center to prepare the food and the setup.

If you would like to help wrap the 600 gifts the week before, or can spend time at the party, call G.K. Kevin Sheehan 216-389-0222 to volunteer your, and your family's, services.

TEND TO THE SICK AND PROVIDE CLOTHING WHEN NEEDED. JIM BAILEY, PGK and FDD, along with his wife Janet, have served as Brecksville V.A. Hospital Chairman, with the assistance of Tom and Janice Lisy and a whole host of North Olmsted Knights and their wives.

Each year a gift shop is set up for the vets. Escorted by a Knight, each vet can select clothing and toiletries for himself/herself, and gifts for the spouse and children. The wives take care of the package addressing, the wrapping, and the mailing.

It's quite a system and it really works wonders for the vets to let them know somebody cares about them. Dates in 2007 are setup Dec. 3rd, Shopping Dec. 4, 5 and 6 and teardown Friday Dec. 7th. 


