

Grand Knight's Report

Brothers, I hope this letter finds you well. Happy Easter! He is Risen! Indeed he is Risen! Kristen and I have you all in our prayers. The long Covid winter has finally abated somewhat and we are getting ready to resume normal operations. We will begin in-person meetings on Wednesday, April 21st for our regular social meeting. Meeting will start at 7:30 but join us for the Rosary at 7:15. Our normal schedule will resume after that with our next regular business meeting held on Wednesday, May 5th.

Our first event, appropriately, will be a Memorial Mass to be held at St. Clarence Church on Wednesday, May 19th at 7:00pm. Please plan to attend. We will have a small reception afterwards. Even though the vaccination program will be well underway by then, please plan on wearing a mask and observing social distancing. We have lost more than our share of members over the last 18 months and it is only fitting that as we come back together finally, we start by honoring those who went before us. Please mark your calendars for our annual family picnic which will be held at St. Clarence Pavilion on Sunday, July 25th. We will begin the festivities around 2:00pm. Keep an eye out for more announcements with further information.

Our charity account is critically low on funds. As you know, Covid curtailed our efforts to sell charity raffle tickets at Giant Eagle for two years in a row. We have been relying exclusively on you to make up the difference. The officers have been meeting throughout the pandemic to assess how best to distribute our limited funds and have had to make tough decisions on which donations to suspend. Plus, we chose to respond to critical needs within our brotherhood and the community that were brought on by the Covid19 pandemic such as supplying funds to the Ox Cart hunger center in North Olmsted. It is critical that we continue to meet the challenges that the pandemic has wrought on our community, but we are attempting to do so without a consistent source of revenue. The officers have redirected funds from our general account to our charity account to help sustain our giving but we are now at a critical point. Notice I have included 10 more charity tickets with this newsletter. I know most of you have already sent in your funds from the initial mailing, but we are asking you to do more. This charity campaign is our only source of income and, given the pandemic, you, our membership, are our only source of revenue. Your generosity made our fall Football Crazr campaign a success! Due to Covid restrictions we will push back the launching of our annual Jail Ministry Fundraiser to fall of 2022. In the meantime, we will once again be offering our council members the opportunity to participate in this ministry through our "Pass the Hat" campaign. The council will match up to \$200 of the donations we can raise through this campaign. Inmates in our prison system sometimes struggle to get the essentials including even enough food. Your generosity is desperately needed. Last year we raised over \$500 with this matching gift campaign. Let's try to exceed that this year! Fr. Walters and all the incarcerated men at the county jail really could use our help. Given that we haven't been getting together to pass the hat the officers went ahead and sent Fr. Neil Walters \$200 toward his jail ministry. This \$200 (lowered from \$250 due to budget constraints) was set aside in the budget as a matching gift. The officers are banking on your generosity! Note in the memo field "Jail Ministry" on your check. Let's see if we can match that \$200. This particular corporal work of mercy is among the most difficult in the diocese.
