GK Ace Spakowski says — That the Supreme Council in 1944 authorized the establishment of an Educational Trust Fund for one million dollars, to provide scholarships in Catholic colleges for the children of Brother Knights who gave their lives in World War II and later in the Korean conflict.

The benefits of the four year scholarships include not only tuition, but also room and board at a Catholic college of the student's choice, leading to a Bachelors Degree. 459 children are now eligible for these scholarships and of these 60 have already obtained their degrees and 78 other students are still in college. By judicious investments and careful management, the total expenses of the Educational Fund to date have come out of the earned interest.

Reflect a moment on the Educational Trust Fund and you will find the expression of the true fraternal regard that members of the Knights of Columbus have for their Brother Knights.
