NEW INSURANCE PLAN FOR K - C

Men joining the Armed forces are no longer covered by National Service Life Insurance. This program was discontinued in Jan. 1957.

Those brothers who remember the N.S.I.I. that was available during World War II will recall that they could buy a \$10,000 policy for about \$7.00 a month. This was a term plan with premiums increasing every five years. Even though it did not have cash value, it was considered a real good buy.

The Knights of Columbus Insurance department is proud to announce that it now has a modified whole-life plan with only one premium increase of just 15% on the fifth anniversary of the policy. This is not a term plan, but a permanent life insurance policy with cash values, paid-up insurance features and dividends.

The premium for a \$10,000 policy at age 18 is only \$9.70 a month, and if you are in the service, it can be paid direct to your Council Financial Secretary by allotment.
