PONTIFF ASKS ALL CATHOLICS FOR PENANCE

VATICAN CITY (AP) — Pope John, XXIII, in an encyclical published yesterday, asked the Roman Catholic world to do penance to insure the success of the Vatican Ecumenical Council.

The Pope told Roman Catholic bishops in his letter, "Poenitentiam Facere" (To Do Penance):

"One can legitimately hope that a new and more joyous era for the Catholic Church will emerge (from the council) if you can come from your dioceses to Rome for the council, bringing with you a so rich treasure of spiritual good."

The council starting here Oct. 11 will bring together the church's hierarchy, in the first such meeting in 92 years, to seek renewal of Catholicism in the modern world as a prelude for possible Christian unity.

Pope John emphasized in the encyclical that he considered prayer, penance and good works an indispensable preparation for the council. Christ himself explicitly taught penance, the pontiff said and Moses, the prophets and the apostles practiced it.

He said such prayer and penance would be sure "to move in a salutary way even the souls of those who are excessively preoccupied and distracted by earthly things and have lapsed in their religious duties."

Pope John asked Catholic bishops to start in their home diocese novenas, or spiritual exercises to ask the Holy Ghost for "an abundance of heavenly light and divine grace" upon participants in the Ecumenical Council.
