For those of you, who can't take time out to attend meetings, the major projects underway include the following:

STATE YOUTH CAMPAIGN—As you saw from the budget that was mailed to you, your Council has an ambitious youth program that can only be supported by State Youth Funds. As members of this Council you should be PROUD to ask your friends and neighbors to buy a ticket that will help to educate our future Catholic school teachers; help to put deserving boys and girls through school; and allow our North Olmsted youth to take part in state-wide groups learning more about American government. These State Youth tickets also provide for our CYO Camps and other diocesan youth activities.

These are the reasons why your Council goes through the "birth pains" of a State Youth Campaign each year. Brothers, this is your annual opportunity to fulfill your promises made in behalf of charity. All people in our community benefit by this program, can you imagine what taxes would be if the city had to educate the children attending the parochial

schools of our community? The second phase of this campaign is underway, North Olmsted can still benefit if you sell or buy your three books. This is the one time we get each year to do something in the Council for someone other than ourselves.

ISABELLA CARD PARTY—The Ladies Guild has been assured of every cooperation and it in turn has indicated that the Council can depend on its help when needed.

The Guild will hold its annual card party early in November. The proceeds from the raffle will go towards the Council's building fund. Your support of this project dictates how soon you will be able to relax in your own hall.

Your financial officers have established a committee to find and purchase a suitable piece of property on which to build your Council chambers. This LAND will be purchased before 1963 has run its course if you cooperate with the plans established.

If you don't like the plans, then come to the meetings and let us know. You abdicate your responsibility by remaining at home and mumbling in your heard about how everything is railroaded.

This brings up another point, word has been received that some of you are complaining that a clique is running the Council. This is true, the clique is composed of brother Knights who are not afraid to work for the Council, who will accept the responsibility of a chairmanship for a dance or Council affair. You need only come to a meeting and offer your services to become members of this clique. You "stay aways" will be surprised how eagerly you'll be received in the "clique."

Were you asked to join the K. of C.? Almost all of us were approached by a good Catholic friend and asked to join the order. You can return the favor by asking your Catholic friend to join you in promoting Catholicism in North Olmsted. Remember, brothers, we're on record with the State and District that we're going to gain more members than either of the other Councils in District No. 10.

If you can't bring yourself to ask a fellow Catholic to join because you want to help him and yourself to be better Catholics, then ask him because it's going to cost you money if you don't. If our Council loses this membership contest, which WE initiated, then the cost of a party for the winners is coming out of your pocket.

Your Grand Knight has belonged to a myriad of social, civic, religious, professional and fraternal organizations, but not one of them stacked up to Council No. 4731, North Olmsted. The abilities and talents of the individual brothers of this Council make any goal possible. If only each of you will uncover just a little more of your latent dedication to your Council.
