#### HISTORY OF ST. MARY'S PARISH Olmsted Falls, Ohio

Olmsted Falls. John Reynolds was the first Catholic to settle here. The building of the Cleveland, Columbus & Cincinnati Railroad through this section brought other Catholic families, the leader of these families was a James Hickey, (grandfather of Charles Barnum and Mrs. Theresa O'Brien, present members of the parish). Around the year 1849, Catholicism came to

and caused the building of a Catholic Parish. Holy Mass was first said in a barn, belonging to a Protestant villager, Calvin Geer. Afterand its religious needs were taken care of by Priests from Cathedral in Cleveland and from St. Mary's, Elyria. The increasing flow of Catholics, German, Irish and Polish lay people insured the life of the Church in the village For many years, the home of James Hickey on Lewis Road was used for the celebration of wards, a log schoolhouse served as a church In the beginning, Olmsted Falls was mission

Father Louis Filiere became the pastor and organized a parish known as St. Mary's of the Assumption. For just two years, Mass was said in a house owned by Richard Pollard. Father Filiere then purchased a frame house to serve as a church and rector. The following year, 1858 the pastor bought a lot located then on Columbia Road near Plum Creek, and built a wooden Church. At this time freshed St. Mary's, Berea, and St. Patrick's, West Park, as missions. In 1862 Father Filiere was transferred to St. Mary's, Berea, his former parish, and St. Mary's, Olmsted Falls, became a mission. By 1856, a resident pastor was necessary and

school. In the meantime, Mass was said every Sunday in the Olmsted Falls High School Gymnasium (thanks to kindness of our good neighbors). The new building was completed in August 1949, and dedicated May 1950. The Sisters of St. Joseph (Rocky River Drive) became the teachers of the new school. Sister M. Michael was the first principal. The Sisters took care of the religious instructions for the school children on Saturdays for many years previous. The parish increased and the school became crowded. In 1951, the Martin Bilskey home was acquired by the parish and remodeled into a Sister's Convent. Until then the Sisters resided in two rooms in the school.
