VATICAN CITY—(NC)—Mother Elizabeth Ann Seton, foundress of the U. S. Sisters of Charity, and Bishop John Neumann of Philadelphia will almost surely be proclaimed Blessed next March, officials of the Congregation of Rites said here recently.

Although dates have not been definitely assigned, the likelihood is that Mother Seton will be beatified on St. Patrick Day, and Bishop Neumann two days later, St. Joseph Day.

The title "Blessed" is given to those who were of heroic virtue and are certainly in Heaven. The title "Saint" usually follows in due course, and entitles the person to the veneration of the Universal Church.

The Quarterly Communion will be held at St. Raphael's Church on Dover Road, Bay Village, Ohio, Nov. 4th, at the 10 o'clock Mass.
