STATE YOUTH CAMPAIGN

By now, the 1962 State Youth Campaign is in high gear and each of you asking your Team Captain for more books. The emphasis this year is definitely on Benefiting the Youths of our State, our Diocese, and our Council. No one can more wisely invest his time, efforts, and money than to work for tomorrow's leaders.

Let's resolve at this time, with our conscience as our guide, to do the utmost to make this campaign successful. The job is not an easy one—nothing really worth while ever is easily attained. In addition, our quota on books is 669, an increase of 116 books over last year's campaign. This works out to three books per member.

The Campaign is divided into 3 Phases:

- A—Phase 1—Sept. 14 to Oct. 15.
- B—Phase 2—Oct. 16 to Nov. 5.
- C—Phase 3—Nov. 6 to Dec. 8.

Our Council receives the greatest benefit from returns make Phase 1.

As an inducement, the following awards to membership are to be made:

- A—Phase 1—3 books—Credit of 1 month's dues.
- B—Phase 1-10 books—Credit of 6 months' dues.
- C—10 books over 3 Phase period—Credit 3 months' dues.
- D—Top Member in each of three Phases (10 books to qualify)—\$10.00.
- E—Top Member for entire campaign—Gift Certificate \$50.00—25 books to qualify.
- F—Second high member for entire campaign (15 books to qualify) Savings Bond (\$25).
- G—All 10-book or more members, an opportunity on a \$25.00 Saving Bond.
- H—Top Division Leader (\$10.00).

The sixth page of each book is free. Please do not mutilate books. For each 3 books disposed of, your name will be submitted on one of three trips to Florida for two.
