**SELF-EMPLOYED INDIVIDUALS
RETIREMENT ACT**

On January 1, 1963, self-employed individuals, including doctors, lawyers, dentists, accountants, proprietors and partners, became eligible to participate in Treasury-approved retirement programs. The law permitting this action is the Self-Employed Individuals Tax Retirement Act of 1962 (HR-10), which was enacted by the 87th Congress. Under the law, the self-employed persons may establish a retirement plan for themselves and their employees, if any. Up to 10% of earnings or \$2500, whichever is less, may be contributed annually for self-employed individuals. One-half of the contribution in behalf of a self-employed person is tax deductible.

It is estimated that the law affects about nine million self-employed persons in the United States.
