GRAND KNIGHT BILL BONNER REVIEWS ACCOMPLISHMENTS OF PAST YEAR COUNCIL 4731 OFFICERS, COMMITTEEMEN AND MEMBERS COMMENDED

In a statement released to the Narrator, Grand Knight Bill Bonner declared that Council 4731 experienced a very successful 1963-1964 year, stressing that the goals which had been established at the outset had, in most cases, been realized and that the council could look forward to another promising year if the same degree of interest were continued. Grand Knight Bonner was emphatic in stressing that few of the attainments would have been possible without the tireless efforts of the officers and committeemen, or without the support of the members who responded to the various affairs and meetings.

It was a "testament to the loyalty, sincerity, and plain hard work of the 6 point Chairmen under the whip and efficiency of General Program Chairman Henry Kleinhenz," declared Bonner, "that the Council was awarded a beautiful plaque at the 65th Annual State Convention in Cincinnati over the Memorial Day weekend."

Noting that each council operates through a well-designed 6-point program and is awarded merit points for attaining certain requirements, the Grand Knight observed that Council 4731 was among the top 25% of the state's 264 councils attaining the distinct honor of belonging to the 3500 Club.

Special recognition was given Financial Secretary Wayne MacPherson and our Trustees who fulfilled the important task of seeing to compliance with the requirements of the state and supreme councils and the Greater Cleveland Chapter (of which 4731 is a member) which require payment of a per capita tax and certain reports to be filed regularly and on time.

The Kay Cee Club, headed by Milan Penyin, was commended for assuming certain duties formerly performed by the council. Bonner reported that four social events each Council year will be promoted by the Kay Cee Club, namely, the Clam Bake; the Halloween Costume Dance; the Post New Year's Dance, and the Bowling Party. This inter-working of the Kay Cee Club and the Council will be perma-

nent policy and is continuing under current President Ace Spakowski and his fellow officers.

A debt of thanks was expressed to State Youth Chairman, Joe Arnold; Co-Chairman, Jack Shandor; and the various Division Leaders, Team Captains, and all brothers who made the scholarship program so successful. "As a result," stated Bonner, "we were able to expand our Council Scholarship awards to three (3) scholarships. We contributed to the State Council Scholarship Fund and to the CYO locally."

Council 4731 has fulfilled almost every demand, request, and requirement of the Supreme and State Councils, participating, for example, in the annual Track Meet with the Greater Cleveland Chapter.

Among the many other functions and duties performed, Grand Knight Bonner observed, were such "Free" affairs as an "Open House" and the PGK's Testimonial Dinner, as well as the Children's Christmas Party. In addition to this the council was able to bank added funds in the future building treasury, acquire a portable PA system, and increase membership by a dozen new brothers, with the total now standing at 211. Throughout, the council has continued to receive the support, cooperation, and advice of our wonderful Chaplain, Fr. Wagner.

The Narrator, stated Bonner, has continued to keep the council advised of affairs, through the fine editorship of Milan Penyin and co-editor Dick Kusak.

Grand Knight Bonner concluded his statement with expressions of congratulations to those receiving Knight of the Month and Knight of the Year awards; with sincere thanks to his fellow officers, the officers of the Kay Cee Club, and to all the various chairmen and committees "for an outstanding display of the principles upon which our Order is founded." He added that "It has been a singular pleasure for me to be associated with such fine people. You have made the year for me not only bearable, but pleasurable."
