- Did You Know . . . Our first Degree exemption was on February 1, 1959? This was held in St. Richard's Hall. The members of West Park's Council First Degree team had charge of the exemption.
- Did You Know . . . Our council's name was selected on February 18, 1959?
- Did You Know . . . Our first venture to try to make big money was the Mills Brothers' Circus on June 23, 1960?
- Did You Know . . . P.G.K. Pat Garreau was our first Grand Knight on March 4, 1959? He served in that capacity until July 1, 1960.
- Did You Know . . . Our second grand Knight was William A. Beyer, who led us from July 1, 1960 till July 1, 1961? Bill is still very active, now as General Chairman of our 6-Point program.
