1965 ALL-OHIO YOUTH CAMPAIGN

September 25th is the "KICK-OFF" date of the State Youth Ticket Drive. This year's drive, as was last year's, is divided into two phases (four weeks each) and one "clean-up week."

The first phase runs from September 25th and closes on October 24th. The second phase is from October 25th to November 20th. The "clean-up" or "over the top" week is from November 21st to November 27th.

Brothers Jim Wilkins and Dave Wolfe are chairman and co-chairman respectively of this year's drive for Council No. 4731. Their primary aim is to equal last year's impressive record, which was the best that our Council has ever done, and they believe that this can be done if:

1. Each division leader and team captain distributes his tickets as quickly as possible. (Every member of our Council should have his books of tickets no later than Sunday evening, September 26th.)
2. Every Brother Knight make an honest effort to sell just one more book than he did last year.

The rebates this year are very liberal so it is possible for each Council to earn as much as \$3.50 for each book turned in during the first phase and \$3.25 for books turned in during the second phase and "clean-up week."

For the individual ticket sellers there are many prizes to be won. First there will be two district sales contests, one each during the two phases and one area contest that covers the entire campaign. The prizes for these three contests are listed on brochures that will be on display during our meetings from now until November 27th.

Secondly the prizes within our Council will be as follows:

1. Largest ticket seller a \$50.00 savings bond plus dinner for two.
2. Those who sell 10 books or more in the first phase will receive six months dues.
3. Those selling 10 books or more in the entire campaign will receive three months dues.
4. A month's dues for those selling three books in the first phase.

Let's all pull together and make this year's drive a big success. In doing so we will help:

First: The Bishops in Ohio to obtain more funds to help them carry out their youth programs.

Second: Our own Council to have additional money to help enlarge its youth activity, as has been suggested at some of our recent meetings.

Third: Each member obtain a feeling of being a part of a worth-while youth program.
