### AN APPEAL TO YOUR CHARITY-DINNER PLANNED

A combined effort by the councils in District 11, is being made to aid a young girl stricken with a fatal blood disease. District Deputy, Ben Lyons, in answer to a request for his assistance, presented the facts of the situation to all Grand Knights of the District.

Maureen Callahan, a senior at Lourdes Academy, has been seriously ill for about one year. She has been in and out of Cleveland Clinic in attempts to alleviate the pain caused by the terminal blood disease from which she is suf-

At the time this article was being written, Maureen, her mother, and a nurse, were at the world famous shrine at Lourdes, France.

Last Spring, Maureen attended a high school prom. The mother of the boy who escorted Maureen found out about Maureen's condition, and determined to do something to help the situation. As a last ditch effort, the trip to Lourdes was arranged. It was hoped that funds could be raised to pay for the trip, but, due to Maureen's condition, it was necessary that the trip be made as soon as possible or it would never be made.

The boy's mother, with a number of other children at home; one an invalid and a husband who is also an invalid, took the money from her savings to pay for the trip, money which she could not really afford. To convey the deep feeling of faith this woman has is impossible. However, it is possible to partially explain her motivaton, although many of us will never

on her to assist someone else in their hour of need. The woman told the District Grand Knights that it was the least she could do to repay God for being so good to her. She stated the doctors had advised her, that her husband had less than a year to live. That was eighteen months ago. She considered the opportunity to send Maureen to Lourdes as her chance to show thanks to God for permitting her husband to remain with his family as long as he has. In my mind, it is a blessing in itself to be able to view life in this manner. A woman who has to support a family and who has known the emotional and physical pain caused by illness, has felt that God called
