sistance of private and group donations.

The purpose of the Foundation is three-fold:

1. The placing of a child in an environment which is conducive to giving the parents an assurance that the child is happy and well cared for. This in turn, establishes a more normal atmosphere for the remaining members of the family, so essential to the development of normal youngsters, who will be capable of fitting into society in a happy well-adjusted way.

N They expect to cooperate with established centers of research in neighboring communities to determine the cause of certain birth defects, thereby eliminating future misfortunes.

In cooperation with their medical and physio-therapy staff, the children will be given progressive treatment, constantly working toward as high a degree of normaley as possible for each child.
