1966-67 BUDGET PRESENTED AT NEXT MEETING

RESOLUTION

The 1966-67 Budget of the Council was presented to the Council at the Regular Meeting of September 7.

On the recommendation of the Grand Knight and Trustees the following Resolution was presented:

"Be it resolved, that the 1966-67 Budget as presented to the Council, be approved as submitted."

The voting for approval or rejection will take place on September 20th at the regular meeting.

1966 ALL-OHIO YOUTH CAMPAIGN

SQUIRES CIRCLE

Our newly appointed Youth Activity Chairman, Richard R. Tischler, is deeply interested in young people and youth work. There is a big push in the State of Ohio this year to promote Squires Circles, and this fits very nicely in with Dick's plans for our youths in the immediate area.

First of all, a Columbian Squires Circle is sponsored by a "parent" Council; and in effect, a Junior branch of a Council. The purpose of a Circle is manifold; and some of the reasons for its existence are to promote the development of young men in the fields of social, civic, and fraternal activities. It is an excellent training ground in the formation of their character and leadership as well as a source for future Knights of Columbus membership.

A Council provides adult Counselors to properly advise, counsel, and direct these young men along the path in their development. It will be remembered that at one time our Council did sponsor Father Culliton Circle No. 1390. Bro. Bill Brehm was instrumental in activating our Circle and spent many, many hours in the formation of the Circle.

Unfortunately, the Circle was forced into "mothballs" three years ago through no fault of the Counselors or the Council. The problem existing was the lack of interest by the boys and their parents. It got so that there were more Counselors at a meeting or social affair than there were Columbian Squires. Subsequently, the Circle was disbanded and the Charter was put in abeyance.

It is now planned by Dick Tischler and the Council to reactivate the Circle if enough interest can be generated.

Any boy between the ages of 13-18 is eligible to join the Squire Circle. His Father need not be a Knight of Columbus for the boy to join. The only basic requirement is that the boy be Catholic.

We are certain that many K of C men in our Council either has a boy(s) of his own, or knows of a boy(s) who is eligible and interested. The size of a Circle is usually limited to 25 boys.
