We are unable to give you any figures at this time on the First Phase turn-in of tickets for the State Youth Campaign. The Narrator copy had to be in the hands of the printer before the October 29th closing of the First Phase.

We are reminded by Co-Chairmen Dave Wolfe and Jim Wilkins of the obligations we have in supporting this most important program.

Some of us are wondering why it is necessary to constantly remind some of the Brothers on every aspect of Council business. We are prompted to mention this because it is simply amazing that there are members who aren't even aware that the State Youth Campaign is in progress. With few exceptions, all Brother Knights should have tickets in their hands. We know that a good many men simply take the books of tickets and put them in a drawer and that is the last that is ever done with them. We also know that some men weren't aware of the Council prizes available for ticket sales, such as free dues, etc. This in spite of the fact that details were printed in the Narrator. Selling tickets is not an easy task for anyone. It is realized that it can be more difficult for an individual to sell just one book of tickets than it can be for another person to sell 10 books. The point is that an effort should be sincerely made to sell the tickets.

If you did not qualify for any Council prizes in the First Phase, the following prizes are still available:

1. Largest ticket seller — a \$50.00 Savings Bond plus a night out for two.
2. Three Months Dues credit for those turning in 10 books or more in entire campaign. In other words, if you had 5 books sold in the first Phase and another 5 books turned in the Second Phase, your Dues would be automatically credited for 3 months. This is worth \$4.50 to you.

So, Brothers, get your returns in. If you cannot sell any tickets, then take at least a book in your name if the family budget will allow.
