We have accomplished this through our Kay Cee Club which was incorporated in 1960, receiving its Charter from Ohio in the same year. All members of North Olmsted Council are automatically members of the Kay Cee Club. The Club has its own Constitution and By-Laws. Any action by the Club must first be voted on by members of the Council; i.e., amendments, elections, property, etc.

Since we don't own any land or real property, it might be wondered why we bother to have a separate corporation at this time. Well, when the time comes when it is opportune for us to purchase property, we will be all set to roll with no delays or red tape. There is also the matter of applying for licenses, etc., and we can then open our records to the proper officials as proof of our sincerity.

The various administrations governing the Kay Cee Club have faithfully kept the records over the years, complying as necessary with the State of Ohio. Several years ago, it was decided that the talent devoted to maintaining
