STATE CONVENTION REPORT

PCK's, Ted Mack and Bill Bonner, attended the 68th Annual State Convention in Cincinnati the weekend of May 26, 27 and 28. Accompanying them were their respective wives, Mary Lou and Elaine; Ray and Lenore Hepner; and Joe and Jean Kucharik.

Bill and Ted report that the business sessions were held with dispatch and coordination. We can look forward to some changes in the various programs that the State Council expects the Subordinate Councils to carry out.
