TIMELY WORDS FROM THE FINANCIAL SECRETARY AND THE TRUSTEES

Non-payment of Dues is always a touchy problem—both for those who are behind in their dues and for those whose job it is to see that they are paid.

In a recent cursory glance at the arrearages, it was learned that there is approximately between \$500 and \$600 outstanding and due by June 30th, 1967.

It is time for the current year's budget to be figured based on expected income from Dues. If the Council does not receive the anticipated revenue from Dues, then it is quite obvious that the Council finds it necessary to curtail its activities. Do you want this to happen?

Here's another thing to think about. The yearly dues for our Council are \$18.00. Out of this comes \$4.75 in per capita tax payable to Supreme Council, the State Council, and the Greater Cleveland Chapter. Now, these taxes have to be paid whether we receive any money from a member or not. In effect then, the regular, dues-paying members are being penalized because they have to pay the per capita taxes for those whose dues are in arrears or just simply and conveniently forgotten about. So, fellas, give Jim Wilkins, our Financial Secretary a break. Mail him your dues. You know, it costs money for postage, not to mention all the unnecessary time.
