STATE YOUTH DRIVE

By now most of you realize that we're right in the middle of the First Phase of our Annual Ohio State Youth Campaign. The First Phase runs until Oct. 14, and this is the time when the Council can reap the largest benefits for itself.

Chairman Jay Ellis and Co-Chairman Henry Klienhenz remind us that the quota is 3 books per member (total of 693). For the benefit of the Members not in the Campaign before, the Council derives its monies from the Youth Drive to support our own local Youth programs; and the State Council does the same to support Statewide Projects. We share the proceeds, approximately, on a 50-50 basis. The prizes offered are probably the most attractive to date: 1st Prize—\$100.00 a Month for Life; 2nd Prize—\$50.00 a Month for Life; 3rd thru 15th—\$1,000.00 Cash each.

As our own personal incentive to do a good job, the following Council prizes are to be awarded:

\$50.00 Savings Bond to the top seller.
Six (6) Months free dues to anyone turning in 10 books sold by Oct. 14 (end of 1st Phase).

Three (3) Months free dues to anyone turning in 10 books sold by Nov. 11. In other words, if you cannot turn in 10 books by Oct. 14, you can turn in the balance by Nov. 11 and still be entitled to (3) months free dues.

One (1) month free dues to anyone turning in minimum of (3) books, but less than 10, during the First Phase.

In addition, the State Council is awarding Prizes in each Council:

Highest seller (35 books minimum) — a mini-hi-fi outfit.

Second highest seller (25 books minimum) — A Florida Vacation Certificate for two (2).

As you can see, we can well afford to be personally selfish. So, get out and get on the ball.

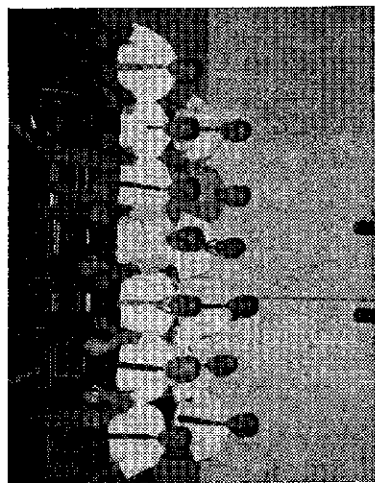
