On May 7th the Officers of both the KayCee Club and the Council appointed PGK Ray Hepner and Fin. Secy. Frank C. Stanzo to negotiate for property and a job to meet with Fairview Council pertaining to the merger of both Councils. Merger talks are still pending, and has nothing to do with our purchase of any property.

The property we are going to vote on is located at 30338 Lorain Rd., North Olmsted (Allen Tourist Home). Five bedrooms, four baths, third floor tourist rooms, totally enclosed front and side porch, large garage, outside fire place and small orchard. Lot is 150' frontage and 763' deep. We can buy for \$42,500 with a 20-year program at 8% $\frac{1}{2}$ taxes are \$597.50 per year; sewer assessment is \$11.70 per foot. This house can be used now for meetings, etc. Zoning will not make any difference to the KayCee Club as we are a Non-profit corporation and can operate at this address. We have check on liquor license and private club license-both are available to us.

The purchase of property and club rooms has been a long time coming for our Council. The Officers of both the KayCee Club and the Council are all for this purchase so we can have a home we can really call our own.
