

2025 Data and Impact Report – Emergency Animal Care & Help

This report provides a snapshot of EACH's impact, growth, and stewardship over the past year. The data below reflects direct emergency veterinary assistance, expanded partnerships, and increased community presence across Maui. Together, these metrics illustrate both the scope of need and the organization's commitment to thoughtful, effective response.

Geographic Reach

EACH has now provided assistance across all major regions of Maui, including:

- **Hāna**
- **Upcountry Maui**
- **Lahaina**
- **Kahului**
- **Kihei**
- **Wailuku**

In addition:

- **Served a client from Lānaʻi**
- **Assisted a client who had recently relocated from Molokaʻi**

Together, this reflects island-wide reach and access, including rural, remote, and inter-island households.

Animals Assisted

- **Total animals/households helped: 44**
 - **Dogs: 24**
 - **Cats: 19**
 - **Other species: 1 goat**

- **Note: This total does not include three additional animals assisted since the start of the year**

40 out of 44 animals were successfully saved. Two cases were on the border of qualification (one possibly too ill and one possibly too old), the other died from an unrelated anesthesia response, and the other after doing fine, had a relapse after a week and succumbed.

That equals a **90.91%** success rate.

Despite the severity of cases served, 90.9% of animals receiving emergency assistance were saved from surrender, euthanasia, or neglect. Eligibility decisions are made collaboratively with veterinary staff, balancing medical viability, urgency, and responsible use of limited resource. This outcome reflects our close coordination with veterinary staff to ensure assistance is directed to cases where treatment is appropriate and has a strong likelihood of positive impact. We had one case of end-of-life services, and had one call where the person refused moving forward because she did not want to get her dog neutered as per our policy.

Efficiency Indicator

Financial Allocation

- **Total organizational spending:** \$44,526.03
- **Direct emergency veterinary care:** \$39,832.99

Percentage of funds used for direct animal care: 89.43%

The majority of organizational spending is allocated directly to life-saving veterinary services, reflecting strong fiscal stewardship and mission focus. With 89.4% of total expenditures dedicated to emergency veterinary care, EACH maintains a high-efficiency service model while achieving a 90.9% positive outcome rate. Anything above ~75–80% direct program spend is considered strong in nonprofit evaluation. We are well above that line *while serving only high-acuity emergency cases*. This combination is rare and something we should be proud of.

Veterinary & Service Network Growth

Clinic Partnerships

- New clinic partnership added: **Wailuku Pet Clinic**
- Expanded clinic relationships have increased response capacity and referral efficiency

Closing Summary

Over the past year, EACH has demonstrated measurable impact through responsible stewardship, strong clinical partnerships, and island-wide reach. With over 90% of assisted animals remaining safe and out of surrender, euthanasia, or neglect, and nearly 90% of organizational spending directed to emergency veterinary care, EACH continues to operate with both effectiveness and accountability. By pairing emergency intervention with education and outreach, EACH is building a more sustainable, prevention-focused animal care ecosystem across Maui. These outcomes reflect a thoughtful, collaborative approach and position the organization for continued growth, deeper partnerships, and long-term community benefit.
