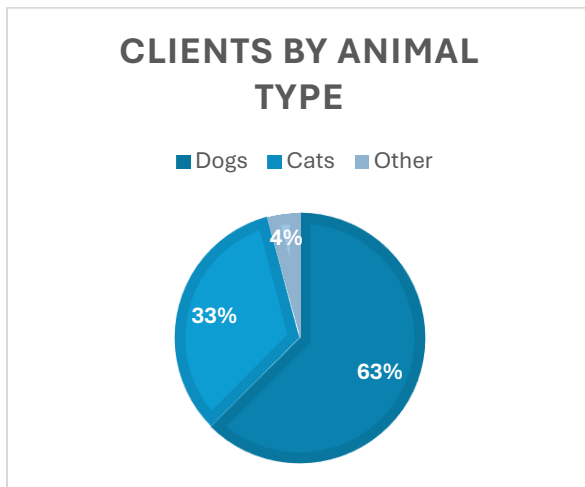

### By the Numbers

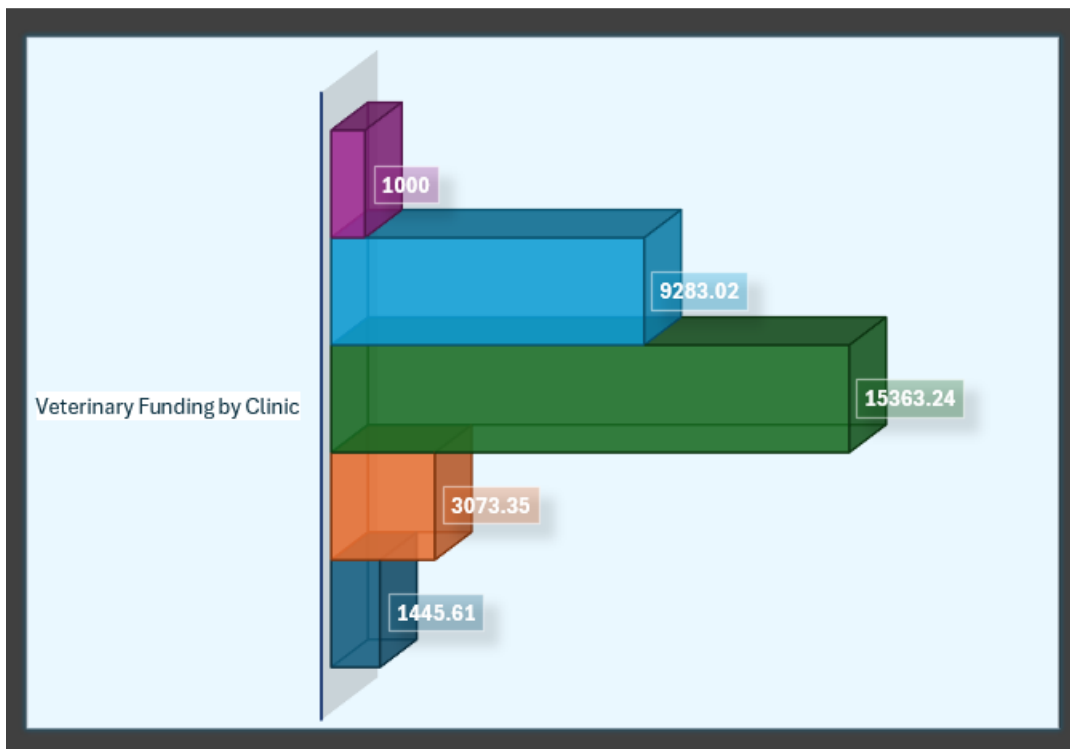


- **Clients Served:** 24

## Stories of Impact



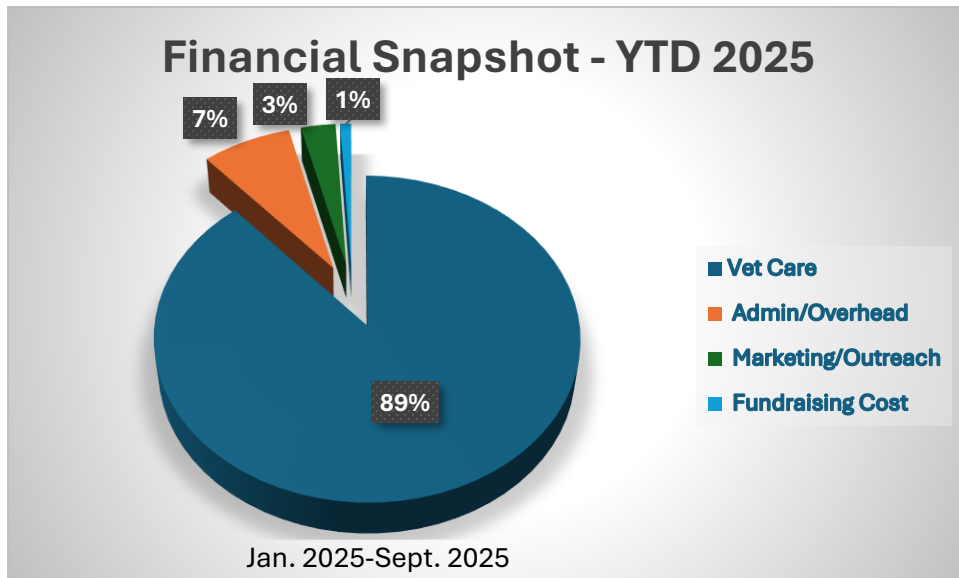
Charlie was a stray that was slowly adopting his family. One day they noticed he had a broken leg. Unfortunately, other animal resources on Maui could not help them out. The family reached out to EACH and with the agreement he would become their official pet and EACH was able to fund the operation and treatment needed. He is making a full recovery and is now spoiled with his adoring ohana.

Poppy the goat, was extremely sick. Her owner had a wealth of knowledge in keeping her goats healthy and happy, but when Poppy started shaking uncontrollably, unable to walk, and became hypothermic, her owner knew she was in bad shape. She reached out to Emergency Animal Care & Help and was able to receive care from the Makawao emergency veterinarian who came and did a house call. The owner stayed with her all night with two heating pads, and with the love from her family and the treatment EACH was able to provide from the vet, Poppy survived and got better and is now thriving and happy at home.
