Who Knew? Member Spotlight

What a surprise to see the beautiful weaving Dianne Emond contributed to the Las Senoras raffle at the Boyd Ranch. Maybe some of you are aware of our talented weaver among our group and others may not. We asked Dianne to tell us the history of how she got into weaving.

"I first began weaving in 1970 in Kansas where I did many juried shows. While living in Chicago during the eighties a friend and I started a business selling our weaving. Then I took a long break from weaving and went back to teaching only weaving as

a hobby. I mainly wove Colonial patterns ranging from very fine linen work to table cloths and bedspreads. Three years ago I was fortunate enough to take a Navajo weaving course from two very well known Navajo weavers, Linda and Barbara Teller. I took this course while back home in New Hampshire of all places! I was hooked. Since then I have also been trying my hand at Zapotec and Chimayo style weaving. Needless to say my type of weaving has changed. Last summer while back in New Hampshire my husband and I visited the woolen mill, Harrisville Designs, where I took the Navajo course and he became enamored with a large rug loom which they built in collaboration with Peter Collingwood (probably the most famous rug weaver of all time). Guess what?

We came back to AZ with one. It's huge and it barely fits into my studio! At the present time I'm only doing commissions."

Dianne and her husband Pete have been coming to Wickenburg since 1970 when her parents retired here. Her mother helped start Las Senoras right after the Museum fire. The Emond's built a home here fifteen years ago and since her husband's retirement two years ago, spend the majority of their time in Wickenburg.
