New underwear, socks, undershirts, camis and bras for girls (must be unopened in package).

#### **Personal Hygiene Items**

Diapers, wipes, deodorant, lotion, hair products for girls and boys, body sprays, cologne, toothbrushes/toothpaste, floss, makeup, brushes/combs, scarves/du-rags, contact solution, chapstick, soap, shampoo, conditioner, razors, feminine hygiene products.

#### **School Supplies**

Backpacks, notebooks, pencils, pens, markers, colored pencils, crayons, binders, folders, paper, boxes of tissues, disinfectant wipes, hand sanitizer.

#### Etc
