Brislington Football Club are delighted to announce the start of an innovative Designer and Artist in Residence project with designer Ken Borg and artist Jonathan Kelham. The locally based creative duo will be working collaboratively with the committee, management team and volunteers at the club over the next 3 years with the residency culminating towards the 2026-27 season, which is the 70th Anniversary of the club.

As Designer & Artist in Residence the two Briz supporters will develop several projects across Ironmould Lane, creating a number of practical visual improvements throughout the ground to improve the match day experience, alongside the implementation of a contemporary graphic identity and other innovative initiatives to promote the club across the Brislington community and beyond.

The collaborator's first project is the refurbishment of the 150 capacity Colin Arnold grandstand, which was last extended and refurbished in the 1990s.

Club Chairman Jack Rogers welcomed Ken and Jonathan to the club:

"On behalf of everyone at Brislington Football Club, I am delighted to welcome Ken Borg and Jonathan Kelham to the club as our first ever Designer and Artist in Residence. Charlie Ames - Defender

Club Statement

Brislington Football Club will not accept any liabilities for accidents to spectators or their property either within the ground or in its premises. Children and spectators must not sit or stand in front of the railings surrounding the pitch at any time.

Please assist the club with this request as serious injury could occur. We must ask that spectators comply with the following regulations:

- 1. Anyone within the Stadium must comply with Club Officials instructions and shall not use foul, abusive or racist language or offensive gesture towards anyone.
- 2. No alcohol will be consumed outside of the club house, before or during a match and no glasses are to be taken outside of the Charlie Garland Bar at any point.
- 3.No person(s) shall enter onto the playing field before, during, between or after a match. The pitch surface is out-of-bounds at all times.
- 4. Only authorised personal are to enter the Changing Rooms and Hospitality suits on matchdays.

These rules are designed in order to ensure our officials and visiting officials, as well as all spectators enjoy football without any offence from others upsetting their ga<mark>me,</mark> and to ensure t<mark>he</mark> day is enjoyed by all!



Good Afternoon All

Since the last programme we've had four games, and for the first time since pre-season two training sessions! The win against Torpoint was a game of two halves. We played well in the first half taking a two goal lead into the break but were under the cosh in the second and had to fight hard to keep our noses in front, with Ryan making two great saves at the death to see out the win. It was an important 3 points given the level of injuries that we have had in recent months. In fact it was a good test to the youngsters who have stepped in so ably to experience a backs to the wall situation and come through with the win.

Next up we travelled to Ilfracombe, who we'd already beaten in the league at home and came away with a 2-2 draw. Given their league position this may not seem like a good result however they had recently parted ways with their manager which had coincided with an upturn in form, having beaten Street and Torpoint in their previous two outings. The pitch was very difficult to play on and we were a little slack defensively in the first half but we scored two good goals and again had many chances to have won the game which is positive, but frustrating, and this made me double my efforts to look for extra firepower up top. A big plus that day was that at least this time they had all of their floodlights working and our coach driver managed not to hit anything in the car park!!

The following Saturday we travelled to Ivybridge, again coming away with a slightly frustrating but hard fought draw. New signing Shea Mannings showed his qualities and scored a fabulous goal late on, which I think is at the very least what we deserved. Ivybridge are an extremely strong physical outfit and there were a couple of very dubious challenges and some questionable refereeing decisions to contend with, and all in all I came away feeling positive. In particular I was very happy to see Jordan Ricketts back in the fold after 3 months out and Jay Malpas coming through unscathed.

Wednesday saw us head to high flying Clevedon Town in the league and to be honest, despite having some grievance with the 2nd and 3rd goals, we were beaten by the better side. However I wasn't too despondant as if we were a little more careful in possession I think we could have turned the game more in our favour, and I fell that after a difficult period, we are seeing the green shoots of growth that I think will see us continue to improve as the weeks go on (I caveat, as long as the injuries subside)!!

I'm expecting todays test to be similar to Tuesday night, as with most games in this league there's no respite, Street are sitting 4th in the table and have lots of god players at this level so it's no surprise they're up there competing at the sharp end! You really do need to be 'on it' to compete in just about every game at this level so hopefully the lads are 'on it' today.



Club History

The club was established in 1956 as an under-16 team, and initially played in the Bristol Church of England League, winning the Somerset Intermediate Cup in 1961–62 and 1962–63, and the Somerset Junior Cup in 1963–64. By 1965 the club were playing in the Senior Division of the Bristol & Suburban League.

During the 1970s we moved up to the Somerset County League, winning the League Cup in 1976–77, and finishing as runners-up in the Premier Division in 1979–80, 1983–84 and 1984–85.

The club went on to win the Premier Division and the Somerset Senior Cup in 1988–89, and after finishing as runners-up and winning the Senior Cup in 1990–91, they were promoted to Division One of the Western League.

Brislington won the Somerset Senior Cup again in 1992–93, and after a third-place finish in Division One in 1993–94, they won both Division One and the Senior Cup the following season and were promoted to the Premier Division.

After winning the Somerset Premier Cup in 1995–96, the club were Premier Division runners-up in 2002-03 and again in 2012-13.

Due to the escalating travel costs of the Toolstation Western League Premier Division, which forced Odd Down to take voluntary relegation, and with a sideways move to the Hellenic Premier ruled out, the club decided to follow Odd Down's lead and take the step down to the Toolstation Western League Division one.

This proved to be a decisive move as the 2022/23 Season saw the Foxes win the league, scoring 130 goals in the process, and reach the Semi Final of the Les Phillips Cup.

Brislington were unable to return to the Premier Division, although this was a blessing in disguise as that season saw the demise of Ashton & Backwell as a Western league club and Bitton, who failed to fulfil their fixtures, pulling out midway through the season, both falling foul of the increased running costs.



The 2023/24 Season saw the reintroduction of an U18s side as the club look to rebuild a pathway to adult football from within.

Unfortunately the season was plagued by poor weather, far too many games were cancelled due to persistent rain, leaving all three teams a far-from-ideal heavily-backloaded schedule. Despite that however, all three teams were to gain a level of success on the pitch.

The first team were promoted back to the Premier Division albeit via the play-offs, after finishing a very disappointing seventh in the table (despite finishing the league's leading goalscorers). However they redeemed themselves by beating Radstock Town away in the semi-final then Wincanton Town away 2-3, where a dramatic second-half comeback saw a two-goal first-half deficit overturned with the winner coming in the 93rd minute, curtesy of Lewis Dunn!!

They also reached the Final of the Somerset Senior Cup although that game wasn't played due to the backlog of league fixtures, both the semifinal and final were due to be played before July 31st 2024!

The reserve team made it to their cup Final. Unfortunately they would lose to opponents Haywood Village, missing out on penalties after the game couldn't be settled in 90 minutes.

The U18s, lead by John Smallwood, Phil Wiltshire & John Lovell were a revelation, winning their league losing only one game in the process.

More importantly from a club perspective, 10 young players were to feature for the first team, unsurprisingly none looking out of place, with a few excelling, proving the decision to reintroduce an 18s set-up was a very good one.













Bris' Late Goal is No Go in Tie with Mangos

A battle of the unbeaten unfolded as Brislington faced Mangotsfield on a cold, frosty evening. A small but dedicated crowd braved the conditions to support, including local football reviewer Stoner, who also generously served as the matchday sponsor—our thanks to him for his commentary, review, and support. The game proved to be an entertaining spectacle, showcasing the very best of the Western Counties League as both teams gave everything in a thrilling contest.

Familiarity bred mutual respect, with most players knowing each other well, adding to the game's competitive but spirited nature. In the end, a draw seemed a fair result, despite the controversy of a late Brislington goal being wrongly ruled offside. Metrics reflected the closely fought encounter, with Mangotsfield perhaps edging certain aspects. Both sides remain unbeaten but will likely rue the ground lost on league leaders Yeovil. The game began at a lively pace, with Brislington enjoying early control and creating some promising chances that ultimately went unfinished. Mangotsfield, however, posed an equal threat, quickly finding their stride and making dangerous advances into the final third.

It was the visitors who broke the deadlock in the 13th minute, as their tricky left winger delivered a sharp low cross. Smallwood managed a parry, but the Mangos striker was quickest to react, slotting home the rebound.

Buoyed by the goal, Mangotsfield nearly doubled their lead shortly after. The striker beat the offside trap and attempted a chip over the advancing Smallwood, but the effort sailed harmlessly over the bar. This let-off seemed to re-energise Brislington, who resumed their attacking play and carved out a golden opportunity on the half-hour mark. However, the Mangos keeper produced a decisive intervention to maintain the visitors' advantage.

As the half drew to a close, Mangotsfield came close again, but a spectacular save from Smallwood, tipping a goal-bound effort expertly over the bar, kept Brislington in the game. The half ended with Mangotsfield marginally ahead in both scoreline and proceedings.

Match Report - Second Half
The second half picked up where the first left off, with both teams trading attacks and creating dangerous opportunities. Frustration began to surface as the intensity increased, leading to manager Lewton receiving a caution from the referee. Moments later, that frustration turned to anger as casual defensive play from Brislington in their own third was punished by Mangotsfield, who capitalised on a mix-up to double their lead. The Bris camp was further aggrieved as Lewton contested the referee's decision not to blow the whistle to properly restart play in the lead-up to the goal and the lack of defensive composure that led to the chance.

Trailing 2-0, Brislington had a mountain to climb.
Straight from the restart, Jayden nearly halved the deficit, but his shot rolled just wide. Minutes later, Sweet came close as well, but the Mangos keeper closed down the angle to make a crucial save.

Recognising the shift in momentum, Lewton introduced fresh legs and adjusted the team's shape.

The changes paid off quickly. Substitute Archer initiated a move down the left, finding Lovell, who beat his man and squared the ball for Radway to finish neatly, bringing Bris back into the contest. The equaliser wasn't far behind, coming in the 73rd minute as Ames, in fine form, linked up brilliantly with Pritchard to level the scoreline. The pair's growing chemistry has been a highlight in recent games.

With the momentum now firmly in their favour,
Brislington pressed for a winner, carving out several
good opportunities. Both teams pushed hard in the
final 10 minutes, risking their unbeaten records in
pursuit of all three points.

In the 99th minute, Brislington thought they had snatched a dramatic winner. A counterattack initiated by Smallwood saw Lovell driving into the Mangos penalty area. After some frantic defending, the ball fell to late substitute Redman, who poked it into the net, sparking wild celebrations. However, the joy was short-lived as the linesman's flag ruled the goal offside. Video footage later revealed the decision to be incorrect, leaving Bris feeling robbed of a decisive moment.

Ultimately, the match ended in a draw—a result that seemed fair given Mangotsfield's spells of control and their own share of chances.



Meet The Visitors

Founded in 1880, Street Football Club is one of the oldest Association Football clubs in Somerset and were given the nickname 'The Cobblers' due to the large shoemaking industry in the village and surrounding area. The Club won the Somerset Senior League 5 times and the Somerset FA Senior Cup 3 times before making its first foray into the Western League a few seasons before the onset of World War One. The Club also had its best FA Cup runs reaching the First Round Proper twice, once either side of World War Two; in 1938 away to Ipswich Town and 1947 at Cheltenham Town - after beating Yeovil Town 2-1 in front of a record 5,000 crowd at The Victoria Field in the previous round. The closest the Club came to winning the Western League Championship during the 20th century was in season 1952-53 when they were pipped to the title by Barnstaple Town, who had a 0.01 better goal average after the sides had finished level on 44 points each. Season 1996-97 saw the Club win the Somerset Senior League for a record eighth time, thus gaining promotion back to the Western League after a 37-year absence.

Ten years later, after gaining promotion to the Premier Division in season 2005-06, the Club had its best run in The FA Vase when reaching the Fifth Round Proper before losing at

Club had its best run in The FA Vase when reaching the Fifth Round Proper before losing at Wimborne Town. After finishing as Premier Division Runners-up the previous season, the 2017-18 campaign was the Club's 50th in the Western League, and was a momentous one too! Early results were inconsistent: but starting on 12th September, manager Richard Fey's charges completed a sensational run of 26 consecutive league victories that eventually saw the team win the title by 15 points (falling just one point short of the century) after winning 32 of their 38 games and scoring 100 goals, thus earning a place in the Southern Football League for the first time in the Club's 138-year history. However, 2018-19 was to be the only season at the higher level for the Club as it soon became clear that Southern League football was a 'step too far' and despite a respectable seventh-place finish, the decision was taken to protect the long-term future of the Club and return to the Toolstation Western League.

2024/25 is set to be a new exciting chapter for club with a new logo relaunch and Ben Watson and Scott Laird appointed as new managers.
