FROM THE DUGOUT

Last week seen a welcome Plymouth Parkway front of 211 spectators our biggest gate in a league game for a few years. It would turn out to be our toughest game this season. We reverted to a 3-5-2 formation in the hope we would stop there full back bombing forward. Gingell & Dagger we're deployed as wing backs to try and stop them.

The away side showed their intent and came at us from the start. They were ahead after 8mins when good work down the right and a decent cross in left the forward with an easy finish.

We tried to get into the game Dagger's shot didn't have enough power to trouble the keeper. And the away defence were dealing with most things we tried. On 30mins we were 2-0 down another move from the right was easily finished. Our best chance fell to Simpson whose snap shot hit the bar. HT 2-0

We changed formation and were proving difficult to break down but could not get <u>nothing</u> going forward. On 72mins a mistake at the back let in the striker to make it 3-0. On 82mins the impressive right back caused us more problems and set up the sub to wrap the game up at 4-0

On Tuesday we went to Odd Down with hopes of getting a result. We probably put in our worst showing this season and despite going 1-0 up with a Nielsen penalty we found ourself 2-1 down at half time.

A stern talk at half time <u>seem</u> to push us into action but on 52mins another defensive error let the home side in for 3-1.

We reduced the deficit on 64mins when Neiks made it 3-2. Sub Clarke Taylor hit the post near the end but that was as good as it got.

We definitely need to up our game to get anything against today visitors Buckland Athletic.

Next week sees us make the long trip down the M5 & A30 to play St Blazey in FA Vase.

BRISLINGTON FOOTBALL CLUB CORONAVIRUS RISK ASSESSMENT PREPARED BY KEVIN HAZELL COVID19 OFFICER

Introduction

Brislington Football Club recognise that operating during the Coronavirus Pandemic requires us to ensure we are protecting our members and users whilst minimising the risk of spreading infection.

The systems implemented are intended to introduce consistent measures in the football club in line with the Government's current recommendations on social distancing.

These are exceptional circumstances and Brislington Football Club and our members recognise that we must comply with the latest government & FA advice on Coronavirus at all times.

The health & safety requirements the football clubs must not be compromised at this time. If an activity cannot be undertaken safely due to lack of suitably qualified personnel being available or social distancing being implemented, it should not take

NOTE

Brislington FC club management will monitor the systems implemented and if it is not consistently implementing the measures set out below. It may be required to shut down.

5. Hand washing

- Provide additional hand washing / sanitizer facilities in various places around
- Ensure soap and fresh water is readily available and kept topped up.
- Regularly clean hand washing facilities and check soap / sanitizer levels.
- Provide suitable and sufficient rubbish bins for hand towels which are regularly emptied. Bins should be cleaned after the club is shut.
- Turn off warm air hand dryers.

6. Toilet facilities

- Operate a one out one in policy for use of toilets unless socials distancing can be maintained.
- Enhance cleaning regimes for toilets (at least every hour)
- Provide suitable and sufficient rubbish bins for hand towels which are regularly emptied. Bins should be cleaned after the club is shut.

7. Avoiding close contact

- Try to avoid close contact. Brislington FC recognise there may be situations where it is not possible to maintain social distancing and to limit close contact to the minimum time that is possible.
- Try to ensure that non essential physical work that requires close contact should not be carried out.
- Any work that involves skin to skin contact will not be carried out.
- Ensure single use PPE is available and disposed of correctly.
- Increase ventilation in enclosed spaces.

8. Cleaning

Brislington FC recognise that enhanced cleaning procedures will have to take place particularly in communal areas and touch points.

- · Taps & washing facilities.
- · Toilet flushes & seats.
- Door handles & push plates.
- Handrails.
- Machinery & equipment.
- · Phones, televisions, CCTV.
- Deep cleans carried out at regular intervals

1. Self isolation

Anyone who meets one of the following criteria should not come to the football club.

- · Has a high temperature, new persistent cough or has experienced loss of taste or smell - follow guidance on self isolation.
- Is a vulnerable person (by virtue of their age, underlying health condition or
- Is living with someone in self isolation.
- Has been contacted by the government track & trace department.

2. Procedure if someone falls ill.

If anyone who has been present at the club falls ill with any coronavirus symptoms then that person needs to contact the club's COVID-19 Officer immediately. That person needs to arrange for a coronavirus test straight away.

The clubs COVID-19 officer will then check the club signing in book and contact the government track & trace department to inform them of a possible infection within the club. The procedures set out by the government must be followed.

The football club will then receive a deep clean.

3. Travel to and from the football club.

Whenever possible club members & players should travel to the football club using their own transport.

- If possible members & players should avoid public transport.
- If traveling in the same car is unavoidable then the persons in the car should wear face coverings. The car should be cleaned thoroughly after use.

4. Access points and pedestrian routes.

- If possible arrange staggered entry and exit times for arrivals at the football club ie :- home / away teams / officials arriving at pre arranged times.
- Monitor entry / exit points to ensure social distancing is being maintained at all times. If needed mark lines at least a metre apart.
- All persons entering the ground wash or sanitize their hands
- Arrange deliveries for off peak times eg before players / officials arrive or a different day.
- If possible mark out a designated one way pedestrian route around the ground to avoid the need for customers, staff & players to pass each other i.e one way in one way out.

10 Use of clubbouse

Government guidelines for bars and clubs should be followed at all times. These to

- Signing in book for anyone entering the club. One entry & one exit point for the clubhouse.
- Use of contactless payment where possible. Maximum of 6 people per table.
- · No standing at the bar.

11. Playing games & use of equipment.

- Changing rooms only use when it is essential and for a limited time only. Only a limited number of persons to which social distancing allows.
- Showers only to be used if essential and then with social distancing in place.
- . Kit if possible players to wash own kit
- Balls to be cleaned when possible during the game.
- . Goalposts / corner flags to be wiped down at before game / half time / after
- Players bring their own drinks bottles which are labelled.
- Physio / first aid only to be administered with full PPE inc masks, gloves and visor if possible.

THE HISTORY OF BUCKLAND ATHLETIC FOOTBALL CLUB.



The club was formed in 1977, and it was purely a junior club. It started life in the Torbay Pioneer League and Sandringham Road was our home pitch. During this time it was one of the biggest junior clubs in the area, and it won many titles and cups over its early years, including the Devon Youth Cup.

It's a senior club now......Devon & Exeter League

The first big decision the club made was to take a team into senior football, which happened for the start of the 1987-88, and saw us take a place in the Devon & Exeter League, and were placed in Senior Division Three, playing at Coach Road. Roy Holmes took his Under 18 side up into that division, and they were rewarded when they won the league title that season. We moved grounds once more in the 1990-91 season to Decoy Park, which was the season we also won the Wheaton Trophy. Promotions saw us climb into the Premier Division for the 1992-93 season, having again moved, this time to Homers Lane, Kingsteignton.

We spent eight seasons in the Premier Division, winning our first league title in the 1994-95 season, under manager's Nigel Holmes and Roger Madge, who had taken over the reins from Roy Holmes at the start of that season. They remained in charge until the 1998-99 season, with Shaun Bartlett taking over, and the following season Shaun was joined by Phil Bayliss. The second league title was won in the 1999-00 season allowing us to take promotion to the Devon League. We won a number of cup competitions during this time in the Premier Division, including D & E Premier Division Cup, East Devon Senior Cup.

Next step....The Devon League

2000-01 was our first season in the Devon league, with manager Phil Bayliss being joined by Gary Taylor as his assistant. We finished this season as runners-up to title winners Willand Rovers, also we made it through to the semi-finals of the Devon Premier Cup. We spent seven seasons in the Devon League, with our lowest finish being 13* in 2005-06, up until that season we hadn't been outside the top eight. Also in our time in this league we were runners-up in the Throgmorton Cup in the 2001-02 season. In the final ever season of the Devon league (2006-07), we did just enough to gain promotion to the newly formed South West Peninsula League, finishing that season in 12* place.

The South West Peninsula League.... We started life in this newly formed league (which

League's) in the 2007-08 season. Under manager Phil Bayliss we finished that season in 14th place, but Phil was building a squad that he felt was good enough to contest for the league title. In the next season we finished in 3rd place, and then our dreams were realised when we won two consecutive titles, as well as winning the Thogmorton Cup (2009-10). After that first title win, Phil stepped down and was replaced by Steve Massey, but the club parted company with Steve a few months into the 2010-11 season, and he was replaced by playermanager Antony Lynch, who carried on the good work that Phil had put in place and we managed to retain the league title. Then in the 2011-12 season, we applied to the Western league, knowing that a top two finish was needed to take promotion, well it was achieved, but we did relinquish our title, with Bodmin Town coming out on top, but promotion was won. We did become the lowest ranked side to win the Devon St Lukes

Bowl in the 2010-11 season, and we retained it last season,

incorporated teams from the South Western League and Devon

after beating Tiverton Town in both final wins. Pastures new....The Western League Premier Division So for the 2012-13 season, we will be playing football in the Western League Premier Division (Step 5 in the non-league pyramid), which is a great achievement for the club, which is still relatively young in age. Everyone at the club is looking forward to this new challenge, with Gaffer Antony Lynch once again leading the 1st Team. In our first season we finished in tenth place in the final table, but we did win the hospitality Award and the Programme Award. The 2013-14season, the 1st Team will be managed by our very successful 2nd Team manager Adam Castle who took over from Antony Lynch towards the end of the 2012-13 season, with the team finishing the season in 11th place. It was another great season in the history of this great club when the 1st team finished in runners-up spot in the Western League Premier Division, the highest finish in the clubs history in the non-league pyramid. We also won the Premier Division best programme award for the third consecutive season, making it eight consecutive league wins in the last eight seasons. The 1st Team managed by Adam Castle finished in 4th Place in the Western League Premier Division, but not good enough to reach our goal of promotion. The team made it through to the 6th Round of the FA Vase, whilst finishing in 4th place in the league table, but once again just missed out on promotion, in the 2016-17, we also won the hospitality award and best programme awards. It was a fifth place finish in the 2017-18, but we did win the Les Phillips Cup for the first time, but it will be the fixture congestion at the end of the campaign which will be remembered with the number of games our lads had to play including four games in four days and three games in three days, and having played fifteen games in twenty-four days. We also won the best programme award for a fifth time in six seasons.. It was a turbulent season 2018-19, as three managers were used, starting with Craig Duff, then interim boss Adam Castle, and finally Richard Pears (who will continue in the job for the 2019-20 season). We finished in ninth place in the Premier table, and again

won the best programme award.

lifetime, starting with council owned pitches at Sandringham Park (During our time as a junior team), Coach Road and then Decoy Park. In 1992-93 we secured the use of Homers Lane in Kingsteignton (owned by local clay company WBB), and we built that ground up to Devon league standard, which included a small stand, enclosed playing surface and hard standing on three sides. But our big break came in 2003 when we were given the option by WBB to take on South Quarry, on the Torquay side of Newton Abbot, and after a lot of hard work and sweat by a huge number of volunteers, we started life at the newly named Homers Heath for the start of the 2005-06 season, with work on the ground and fabulous clubhouse on-going every season since then. On to the 2015-16 season, firstly there was substantial drainage work done to the playing surface during the summer, and we must thank Viridor Credits for their help in funding these works. Also during the season a lot of work was carried out at Homers Heath, including a new covered standing area, which incorporates two new turn-stiles. The ground was fenced in, and an impressive outside toilet block was built. This work al-lowed the club to achieve a 'D' Ground Grade which is good enough for Southern League football.

The 2nds and 3rds....

The 2" Team started life in the Devon and Exeter League spending many seasons in this league, gaining promotion right through to the Premier Division. But, the club took the decision for the 2007-08 season to move the 2nds from the D & E League to the South Devon League. The 2nds have enjoyed a lot of success over the seasons, with league titles, Devon Senior (three) and Intermediate Cups, all being won by them, with last season winning the prestigious Herald Cup. The 3° Team started life in the South Devon league in 2003-04 season, and they had managed to win promotion every season, although they couldn't achieve it last season (2011-12), and again the have also won many league titles, and cups over this period. Our 2nd Team won the South Devon League Premier Division for the first time, and the 3rd Team won promotion to SDL Division One as well as winning the Fred Hewings for a third time. It was another great season for both our 21nd and 3rd Team's, the 2nds were crowned champions of the South Devon League Premier Division in the 2014-15 season and the 3rd Team won the Division One title as well as retaining the Fred Hewings Cup. The 2nd Team in 2015-16 managed again by Neil Snell retained the South Devon League Premier Division title, and were beaten finalists in the Herald Cup. Our 3rd Team finished the season in the South Devon League Division One as runners-up, in what was manager Nigel Holmes last season in charge. The 2" Team won third consecutive SDL Premier title, while the 3° Team won the Fred Hewings Cup for a sixth time, in the 2016-17 season. There was no silverware for our 2nds and 3rds in the 2017-18, but both had young squads with quality players who will only get better, looking like a bright future for the club. The 2nd and 3rds were very successful in the 2018-19 season, the 2nds won the SDL Premier title and the Herald Cup, while the 3rds won the SDL Division One league cup (Dartmouth Cup) and the

Another new era.....

2015-16 - The club fielded its first Ladies team managed by Grant Fisher, in the Devon Women's League Division One, and they didn't drop a point when winning the league title, and they then added the League Cup, in what was a fantastic season for them. The Ladies 1° Team in the 2016-17 season won the treble, the South West Women's League Western Division title, the Soccerworld League Cup and the Devon FA Senior Ladies Cup, whilst the new Ladies 2" Team were beaten finalists in the Devon FA Supplementary Cup. Our Ladies 1st Team again were South West Women's League Premier Division champions in the 2017-18 season, without a dropping a point, and this now means they will be playing in the FA Womens National League Division One South West Division. Our Ladies 2" Team also won their first ever silverware, when they won the Devon FA Supplementary Cup. In the 2018-19 season the 1st Team played in the National League Division One South West and they finished up in 3rd place for that first time. The 2nd Team won the Devon Women's League Premier Division and won the League cup and were beaten finalists in the Supplementary Cup.

Off the field of play...

Our new ground at Homers Heath won the SWPL Premier Division best ground award in both 2007-08 and 2008-09, and then finished runners-up in both 2009-10 and 2010-11. The clubs match-day programme 'The Bucks Review' has also enjoyed success, winning the best programme award in the Devon League on four occasions, and in the SWPL Premier Division, they won that accolade in each of the five seasons we were in that league, and it also finished in sixth place in the final season (2004-05) of the renowned Wirral Programme Club awards, which had over 1100 entries that season. We have also with the help of Viridor Credits invested in a fantastic drainage system at Homers Heath over the Summer of 2015.

Finally ...

The club continues to thrive both on and off the field of the play and this is due to the hard working ethics of all the volunteers within the club.
