

A real class act, Jordans composure makes his game look effortless, but has grit and quality in abundance. Rightly won players players & managers player of the season in 22/23.


Callum Pritchard - Midfield

George Jones - Midfield / Forward


Hard working player who has boundless energy. Works hard for the team and chips in with a decent amount of goals. Scored a double hat trick against Portishead in the championship winning season.

The club was established in 1956 as an under-16 team, and initially played in the Bristol Church of England League, winning the Somerset Intermediate Cup in 1961–62 and 1962–63, and the Somerset Junior Cup in 1963–64. By 1965 the club were playing in the Senior Division of the Bristol & Suburban League.

During the 1970s we moved up to the Somerset County League, winning the League Cup in 1976–77, and finishing as runners-up in the Premier Division in 1979–80, 1983–84 and 1984–85.

The club went on to win the Premier Division and the Somerset Senior Cup in 1988–89, and after finishing as runners-up and winning the Senior Cup in 1990–91, they were promoted to Division One of the Western League.

Brislington won the Somerset Senior Cup again in 1992–93, and after a thirdplace finish in Division One in 1993–94, they won both Division One and the Senior Cup the following season and were promoted to the Premier Division.

After winning the Somerset Premier Cup in 1995–96, the club were Premier Division runners-up in 2002-03 and again in 2012-13.

Due to the escalating travel costs of the Toolstation Western League Premier Division, which forced Odd Down to take voluntary relegation, and with a sideways move to the Hellenic Premier ruled out, the club decided to follow Odd Down's lead and take the step down to the Toolstation Western League Division one.

This proved to be a decisive move as the 2022/23 Season saw the Foxes win the league, scoring 130 goals in the process, and reach the Semi Final of the Les Phillips Cup.

Brislington were unable to return to the Premier Division, although this was a blessing in disguise as that season saw the demise of Ashton & Backwell as a Western league club and Bitton, who failed to fulfil their fixtures, pulling out midway through the season, both falling foul of the increased running costs.

The 2023/24 Season saw the reintroduction of an U18s side as the club look to rebuild a pathway to adult football from within.

Unfortunately the season was plagued by poor weather, far too many games were cancelled due to persistent rain, leaving all three teams a far-from-ideal heavily-backloaded schedule. Despite that however, all three teams were to gain a level of success on the pitch.

The first team were promoted back to the Premier Division albeit via the playoffs, after finishing a very disappointing seventh in the table (despite finishing the league's leading goalscorers). However they redeemed themselves by beating Radstock Town away in the semi-final then Wincanton Town away 2-3, where a dramatic second-half comeback saw a two-goal first-half deficit overturned with the winner coming in the 93rd minute, curtesy of Lewis Dunn!!

They also reached the Final of the Somerset Senior Cup although that game wasn't played due to the backlog of league fixtures, both the semi-final and final were due to be played before July 31st 2024!

The reserve team made it to their cup Final. Unfortunately they would lose to opponents Haywood Village, missing out on penalties after the game couldn't be settled in 90 minutes.

The U18s, lead by John Smallwood, Phil Wiltshire & John Lovell were a revelation, winning their league losing only one game in the process.

More importantly from a club perspective, 10 young players were to feature for the first team, unsurprisingly none looking out of place, with a few excelling, proving the decision to reintroduce an 18s set-up was a very good one.



UP THE FOXES




BRISLINGTON UNDER 18S











Last Wednesday, 23rd April, the young Foxes made their way to the Hand Stadium at Clevedon to face Bristol Manor Farm in the League Cup final. Meet The Visitors

Nicknamed the Fishermen, the club was formed in 2012 when Brixham United and Brixham Villa merged in the South Devon League. Brixham Villa had been a club since 1953 and had previously won the league in 2007, while Brixham United had previously competed in the Western League between 1976 and 1981. After finishing runners-up in the South Devon League the club were promoted to the South West Peninsula League Division One East in 2014. The League was restructured in 2019 and Brixham were promoted to the Premier Division East, having finished in third place the previous season. Floodlights were installed and the first home match under the new lights was on 10 September 2019, a 2-1 win over Bovey Tracey. The club narrowly missed out on promotion on a points-per-game basis over the next two Covid-affected seasons, and having finished runners-up to Torpoint Athletic in 2022, they won the championship in 2023 and thus promotion to the Western League Premier Division. That season also saw the club's best-ever run in the FA Vase, defeating two higher-level clubs before going out on penalties at Corsham Town in the Fifth Round. The club's ground - now known as The More Seafood Ground - was previously the home of Brixham United.

Brixham AFC is a FA Charter Standard club affiliated to the Devon County FA.
