So here we are again, in my view back where we belong, the Jewson Western League Premier division, and with that, a return to the FA Cup.

As most people know, we took voluntary relegation in 2022, because of the crippling cost of travelling, that decision allowed us to re-group and galvanise the club, which led to two very productive seasons both on and off the pitch. On the pitch both seasons have been very enjoyable, with a league win and a promotion via the play offs (I might add done the hard way, with away games to Radstock, and Wincanton)! Now we're ready for the new challenge.

We've had a decent pre-season and a added a few new players, although I didn't feel the need to add too many. We're under no illusions that this season will provide a far stiffer competition than the previous couple of years! Most if not all of squad have played at this level or higher so we are confident that they're capable of adapting to the different obstacles that we will undoubtedly face, however I feel the main challenge will be consistency as there will be no easy games!!

One thing I can say is that we will give it our best shot, not just to compete, but to strive, starting today against what is likely to be a very strong side making the long journey up from mid Cornwall, who triumphed (with ten men) last time we met them in the FA Vase 3 years ago.

To everyone who's watching let's hope for an exciting game and 3 points, and thank you for your support it's very much appreciated.

Club History

The club was established in 1956 as an under-16 team, and initially played in the Bristol Church of England league, winning the Somerset Intermediate Cup in 1961–62 and 1962–63, and the Somerset Junior Cup in 1963–64. By 1965 the club were playing in the Senior Division of the Bristol & Suburban League.

During the 1970's we moved up to the Somerset County League, winning the League Cup in 1976–77, and finishing as runners-up in the Premier Division in 1979–80, 1983–84 and 1984–85.

The club went on to win the Premier Division and the Somerset Senior Cup in 1988–89, and after finishing as runners-up and winning the Senior Cup in 1990–91, they were promoted to Division One of the Western League.

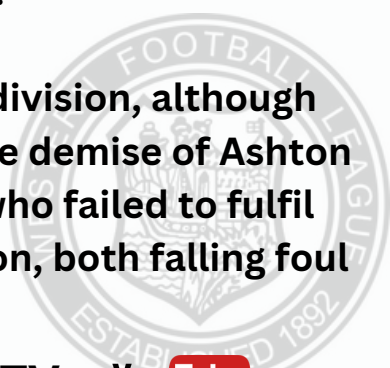
Brislington won the Somerset Senior Cup again in 1992–93, and after a third-place finish in Division One in 1993–94, they won both Division One and the Senior Cup the following season and were promoted to the Premier Division.

After winning the Somerset Premier Cup in 1995–96, the club were Premier Division runners-up in 2002-03 and again in 2012-13.

Due to the escalating travel costs of the Toolstation Western League Premier Division, which forced Odd Down take voluntary relegation, and with a sideways move to the Hellenic Premier ruled out, the club decided to follow Odd Downs lead and take the step down to the Toolstation Western League Division one.

This proved to be a decisive move as the 2022/23 Season saw the Foxes win the league Scoring 130 goals in the process, and reach the Semi Final of the Les Phillips cup.

Brislington were unable to return to the Premier division, although this was a blessing in disguise as that season saw the demise of Ashton & Backwell as a Western league club and Bitton, who failed to fulfil their fixtures, pulling out midway through the season, both falling foul of the increased running costs.



Club History (Cont'd)

The 2023/24 Season saw the reintroduction of an U18's side as the club look to rebuild a pathway to adult football from within.

Unfortunately the season was plagued by poor weather, far too many games were cancelled due to persistent rain, leaving all 3 teams a far from ideal heavily backloaded schedule. Despite that however, all three teams were to gain a level of success on the pitch.

The first team were promoted back to the Premier division albeit via the play-offs, after finishing a very disappointing 7th in the table (despite finishing the leagues leading goalscorers). However they redeemed themselves by beating Radstock Town away in the semi final then Wincanton Town away 2-3, where a dramatic second half comeback saw a 2 goal first half deficit overturned with the winner coming in the 93rd minute, curtesy of Lewis Dunn!!

They also reached the Final of the Somerset Senior Cup although that game wasn't played due to the backlog of league fixtures, both the Semi Final and final are due to be played before July 31st 2024!

The reserve team made it to their cup Final. Unfortunately they would lose to opponents Haywood Village, missing out on penalties after the game couldn't be settled in 90 minutes.

The U18's lead by John Smallwood, Phil Wiltshire & John Lovell were a revelation, winning their league losing only 1 game in the process.

More importantly from a club perspective, 10 young players were to feature for the first team, unsurprisingly none looking out of place, with a few excelling, proving that the decision to reintroduce an 18's set up was a very good one.



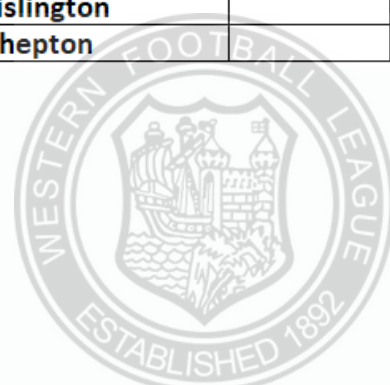

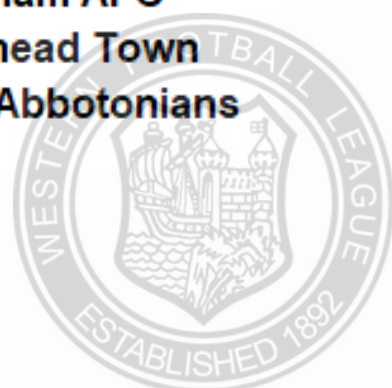

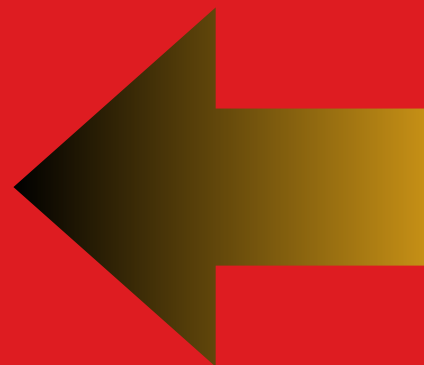

Meet The Visitors



The club was formed in 1896 as a junior club, by Dr. E.S.S. Davis, a member of the Cornwall County Football Association. St Blazey won the Eastern Divisional Cup, Junior Cup, and Bodmin & District League Cup in 1909 and 1910 before it attained Senior status later that year. The club reached the final of the Cornwall Senior Cup twice in the early 1930s, finishing as runners-up on both occasions before winning the competition for the first time in 1936, along with the Cornwall Charity Cup, and Herald Cup to become the first club to win all three trophies in one season. St Blazey were a founder member of the South Western League in 1951, a league which they won thirteen times, including the 2002-03 season when they suffered no league defeats en route to winning the trophy. The club achieved thirty-three victories, and three draws from thirty-six league matches that season, earning 102 points.

St Blazey are considered to be among the most successful clubs in Cornwall. Its first senior league title came in 1955 when the club became champions of the South Western League, a competition which they have won thirteen times in total, while they have finished as runners-up on another ten occasions. The club has also achieved considerable success in cup competitions, including the Cornwall Senior Cup, a competition which they first won in 1936. St Blazey have won the competition eleven times, with their most recent success coming in 2002. They have finished as runners-up on another ten occasions. The club's most recent success came last season when they won the South West Peninsula West division gaining promotion to the Toolstation Western League.
