

FROM THE DUGOUT

Well here we are again just about to enter another lockdown and looking at a suspension of the league season for 4 weeks (hopefully). No doubt with the winter weather due to come we could be looking at a hectic end to the season.

Last week another goal fest was witnessed when we welcomed Clevedon. The game started quickly and Clevedon were 1 up in 7mins when a point blank header evaded Payter. 4mins later we were level; Nielsen whipped a corner in which the keeper failed to deal with and Littlejohn was on hand at the back post to tap home. Barwood was then lost to injury on 26mins.

Both teams continued to press and on 35mins Payter found Simpson, who in turn found Plummer who then set up Miller who's excellent footwork fashioned a shot well in to the bottom corner. Half time 2-1.

We came out quickly in the 2nd half and pressed to increase our lead on 59 mins Tobin made it 3-1 when he finished well after an end to end move. Then on 63mins it was 4-1 when Plummer bundled the ball over the line from a McCormack flick on. What came next was unbelievable Clevedon got back to 4-4 with a quickfire 3 goals in 5mins! However rather than roll over and hold out for the draw, we pressed for a winner. In the 75min a Nuevo -Draper free kick was met at the back post by McCormack. 6 goals in 16mins and the crowd in attendance were certainly getting their monies worth. We were more controlled after that, and although a persistent Clevedon side still pushed which giving us a couple of scares, we managed to see the game out to grab the 3 points.

Another tough game this evening as we welcome an extremely strong Tavistock to the Poplar stadium. Hopefully we won't see a repeat of last year's 7-1 defeat!!

As mentioned this looks like this will be the last game until December due to another national lockdown. Thank you to all those who have attended our home games so far it's been great to see so many new faces around the club. We hope to see you in 4 weeks until then stay safe.

Rich Ford - Assistant Manager



Introduction

Brislington Football Club recognise that operating during the Coronavirus Pandemic requires us to ensure we are protecting our members and users whilst minimising the risk of spreading infection

The systems implemented are intended to introduce consistent measures in the football club in line with the Government's current recommendations on social distancing

These are exceptional circumstances and Brislington Football Club and our members recognise that we must comply with the latest government & FA advice on Coronavirus at all times.

The health & safety requirements the football clubs must not be compromised at this time. If an activity cannot be undertaken safely due to lack of suitably qualified personnel being available or social distancing being implemented, it should not take place.

NOTE

Brislington FC club management will monitor the systems implemented and if it is not consistently implementing the measures set out below. It may be required to shut down.

5. Hand washing

- Provide additional hand washing / sanitizer facilities in various places around the ground.
- Ensure soap and fresh water is readily available and kept topped up.
- Regularly clean hand washing facilities and check soap / sanitizer leve Provide suitable and sufficient rubbish bins for hand towels which are
- regularly emptied. Bins should be cleaned after the club is shut. Turn off warm air hand dryers.

- 6. Toilet facilities
 Operate a one out one in policy for use of toilets unless socials distancing can be maintained.
- Enhance cleaning regimes for toilets (at least every hour) Provide suitable and sufficient rubbish bins for hand towels which are
- regularly emptied. Bins should be cleaned after the club is shut.

7. Avoiding close contact

- Try to avoid close contact. Brislington FC recognise there may be situations where it is not possible to maintain social distancing and to limit close contact to the minimum time that is possible.
- Try to ensure that non essential physical work that requires close contact should not be carried out. Any work that involves skin to skin contact will not be carried out.

- Ensure single use PPE is available and disposed of correctly Increase ventilation in enclosed spaces.

8. Cleaning Brislington FC recognise that enhanced cleaning procedures will have to take place particularly in communal areas and touch points.

- Taps & washing facilities. Toilet flushes & seats.
- Door handles & push plates.
- Handrails.
- Machinery & equipment.
- Phones, televisions, CCTV,
- Deep cleans carried out at regular intervals.

1. Self isolation

Anyone who meets one of the following criteria should not come to the football club. · Has a high temperature, new persistent cough or has experienced loss of

- taste or smell follow guidance on self isolation. Is a vulnerable person (by virtue of their age, underlying health condition or
- clinical condition.
- Is living with someone in self isolation.
- · Has been contacted by the government track & trace department.

2. Procedure if someone falls ill.

If anyone who has been present at the club falls ill with any coronavirus symptoms then that person needs to contact the club's COVID-19 Officer immediately. That person needs to arrange for a coronavirus test straight away.

The clubs COVID-19 officer will then check the club signing in book and contact the government track & trace department to inform them of a possible infection within the club. The procedures set out by the government must be followed.

The football club will then receive a deep clean

3. Travel to and from the football club.

Whenever possible club members & players should travel to the football club using their own transport.

- If possible members & players should avoid public transport.
- · If traveling in the same car is unavoidable then the persons in the car should wear face coverings. The car should be cleaned thoroughly after use.

4. Access points and pedestrian routes.

- · If possible arrange staggered entry and exit times for arrivals at the football club ie :- home / away teams / officials arriving at pre arranged times
- · Monitor entry / exit points to ensure social distancing is being maintained at all times. If needed mark lines at least a metre apart.
- · All persons entering the ground wash or sanitize their hands.
- · Arrange deliveries for off peak times eg before players / officials arrive or a
- different day. · If possible mark out a designated one way pedestrian route around the
- ground to avoid the need for customers, staff & players to pass each other i.e one way in one way out.

10. Use of clubhouse. Government guidelines for bars and clubs should be followed at all times. These to include.

- Signing in book for anyone entering the club. One entry & one exit point for the clubhouse.
- Use of contactless payment where possible. Maximum of 6 people per table.
- No standing at the bar.

11. Playing games & use of equipment.

- · Changing rooms only use when it is essential and for a limited time only.
- Only a limited number of persons to which social distancing allows. Showers only to be used if essential and then with social distancing in place
- Kit if possible players to wash own kit
- Balls to be cleaned when possible during the game.
 Goalposts / corner flags to be wiped down at before game / half time / after game
- Players bring their own drinks bottles which are labelled.
 Physio / first aid only to be administered with full PPE inc masks, gloves and
- visor if possible.

Adhoc football, a cross between rugby union and soccer and perhaps a few other games to boot, took place between Plymouth and Tavistock sides from the mid-1870s, but it took a letter in the Tavistock Gazette from scribes under the pseudonym of "Wei/wisher" and "Halfback", to attract the attentions of two local businessmen. The club was thus founded on September 8th, 1888, the foundation year of the Devon County FA, when sportsman and businessman Herbert Spencer summoned "interested persons to assemble at the Guildhall where a committee was elected under the chairmanship of his brother,

Wilfred, with Herbert as his deputy and another brother, Kingsley, on the committee with Tom Owen Esq as secretary. The old Tavistock Grammar School playing field in Russell Street hosted the newly formed club and the first match against the Duke of Cornwall Light Infantry resulted in a 1-0 victory. The first AGM held at the old Temperance Hotel, now the Ordulph Arms, proudly recorded a first season playing record of Won 13, Lost 3 Drawn 1. By 1890 the club adopted a strip of blue and old gold and formed a second team, moving two years later to Green Lane, Torlands courtesy of the proprietor of the Bedford Hotel. Going from strength to strength the team won the league and were cup runners up in 1900-1901. On one day in 1903 at Torlands on the edge of Dartmoor, a game had to be abandoned due to a sudden blizzard. In the same year wild ducks invaded a flooded penalty area and set up home for a week in a makeshift pond, resulting in a postponed fixture. No wonder that over the next few year's venues changed, from a return to the old grammar school pitch, to Green Hill and Sandy Park. It is believed that in 1913 the entire Tavistock team was selected to represent the County. During the period of 1914-1918 structured football was abandoned. Eventually there were at least three other clubs in the town, Tavistock Comrades, Bannawell Blues United and Tavistock West End. Amalgamation in 1939 produced the familiar colours of red and black. A welcome change to the salmon pink shirts with chocolate collars and cuffs of 1919. The years 1920 to 1930 were successful times with excellent results in the league, Bedford Cup and Senior Devon Cup. Sadly the next decade saw a decline in both results and attendance. Play ceased at the end of the 1931-32 season due to debt. Jumble sales and whist drives were held to ease the financial situation and football resumed once more in 1937. The onset of World War II put things on hold until 1945 when the Lambs joined the Plymouth Combination League First Division. In 1947 the Club President Herbert Thomas Langsford purchased Langsford Park, giving it under trust to the club in 1949. A carved commemorative stone serves as a reminder of his benevolence. In 1952 Tavistock joined the South Western League but were forced to withdraw in 1961 due to financial embarrassment until re-joining in 1968. The Club has been the birthplace of many players going on to enjoy professional paydays



in the Football League including Harold Redmond and Danny Sullivan to Crystal Palace for a fee of £100, Neil and Peter Langman to Plymouth Argyle, Mike Trebilcock, perhaps the most newsworthy footballer to have played for Tavistock scored two of the three goals in the 1966 Cup Final in Everton's 3-2 win over Sheffield Wednesday. Robbie Pethick, Tavistock born and ex-player of the Club, signed professional forms for Portsmouth in October 1993, where he had five successful seasons before moving to Bristol Rovers. The Club won the Devon Premier Cup in season 2001-02 and repeated this success in season 2006-07, by beating Upton Athletic by six goals to nil, creating a record winning margin in the final of this competition. In season 2005-06, the Club reached the last thirty-two in the FA Vase, going out to Pickering Town in a very close encounter. The Club also entered the FA Cup for the first time since 1953-54. Perhaps the saddest entry in this brief history of football in Tavistock is the fire of 3rd February 2011, which all but saw the complete destruction of the old changing rooms and the Red & Black Clubhouse, since then a rebuilding programme has seen the club rise from the ashes and achieve great things by becoming the SWPL East Divisions Champions in 2014/15 and then SWPL Premier Division Champions in 2016/17. Tavistock AFC also made SWPL history the following year by becoming the first club to win both the SWPL Charity Vase and Bowl. Success has continued and after being runners up to Plymouth Parkway in the SWPL Premier Division for the 2017-18 season the Lambs won the league on the last day of the 2018/19 season, beating Plymouth Argyle to gain promotion to the Toolstation Western League. We can say that football is very much alive in Tavistock!


