Shell Club meetings are held on the first Friday of the month, except June, July and August, at the **Seminole Recreation Center, 9100 113th Street North, Seminole**. The doors open at 6:30p.m. and the meetings start at 7:00 p.m. The public is always invited.

In light of the Covid-19 pandemic, it is the general consensus of the membership that we should not have a physical meeting in September. The Suncoast Conchologists have also decided not to have a meeting then.

Instead, we are working to have a joint virtual meeting via Zoom with a talk presented by the Bailey-Matthews National Shell Museum. Dorrie Hipschman, previous director of the museum, had graciously volunteered the museum to provide a presentation via Zoom. Rebecca Mensch is set to present a talk on junonia volutes The meeting will take place Sep 1st at 7PM. Zoom info will be sent via email to all members

How to participate in a Zoom meeting. It is simple. A link to the meeting will be included in an email along with the date and time for the meeting. Click on the link near the time for the meeting (you can do this before the meeting starts; recommend 15 minutes before). If the meeting hasn't started, a box will open to let you know the meeting will start shortly.

Computer directions:

Open your email account. Find and open the invitation email. Click on the link in the email for the zoom meeting. A white Zoom screen will come up and say "When system dialog prompts, click open Zoom meeting." And a lot more. Just wait and a small window will come up that says "This site is trying to open Zoom meeting" and there is a button "Open": click the button. Wait and a small window comes up that has a video of you and at the bottom is a button that says "Join with Video": click that button. A window comes up saying "Wait for Host to let you in"; when the host lets you in, you will see a window that shows your video and the host...then a window pops up "Join with audio": click the button. It the zoom meeting window is not full screen you can make is full screen by clicking the square in the upper right corner.

On the Zoom window there are buttons across the bottom Like mute, video, share, participants etc. You will not need to use most of them.

Android phone:

1st time only

Open the email invitation on your phone, write down the meeting ID number and the Passcode; you will need it later. Tap on the link in the email and it will come up with "Download from Google play store" or "Download from Zoom" Either one will work, and load about the same way. If you choose Google play store you will tap "install". Complete account setup comes up and tap "continue"..(tap skip when asks for credit card), and tap "Not now" when asks about Google play pass. Wait until the install is done (takes seconds) and then tap "open". ZOOM white screen comes up, then a screen Start a meeting. Tap the "Join a meeting" button. Screen comes up asking for the Meeting ID number (glad you wrote it down). Enter the number and tap Join Meeting. Screen asking for Passcode, enter it. Screen comes up asking if you want to Join with video, tap the button. A screen will come up saying to Wait for host to let you in....Host will. Once host lets you in, you should get a window asking to Allow Zoom to take video, tap Allow. You will get a window "call over internet" tap it. This allows you to get audio. And you're in.

If you have zoomed before on your phone, it's really easy. Open invitation email and click on the link. It will ask for your name, type in if not there, hit OK. Then you are in...I get a button that says "Call over internet" and I click it to get the audio. Not really making a call, but if you don't click it, you can not hear anything. Buttons for the zoom meeting are on the bottom, and may have to turn on the video button to share my picture.

Birth Shells (an excerpt)

Birth stones and birth flowers have been established for many years, mainly through the encouragement of jewelers, florists and believers of astrology. There has long been a need for an appropriate birth shell, one that would have some real or fancied significance commensurate with the tradition of birth stones and flowers.

Having interviewed a number of shell dealers and conchological soothsayers, I assembled the following list which I hope will gain acceptance and enhance the pleasures of giving appropriate birthday presents to shell lovers, and make it possible for astrologically informed conchologists to wear correct jewelry adorned with their special birth shells.

September—Heliotrope star shell (*Astralium heliotropium*)

Editor: We've listed only the birthdays mentioned in this issue.

October—Superb gaza (Gaza superba)

November—Thorny oyster/Chrysanthemum shell (*Spondylus* any species such as *S. americanus*)

I WILL **NEVER** "clean out a colony" of shells.


I WILL practice and promote these conservation rules in every way possible.


Molluscs on Stamps

In 2018 Australia issued a stamp set called Reef Safari showing a variety of marine life including a chambered nautilus (*Nautilus pompilius*). In addition to the Nautilus, the other stamps show a Green sea turtle, Olive sea snake, Emperor angelfish, and a Grey reef shark. The stamps were also issued in two self-adhesive booklet formats.

Australia has a huge marine fauna diversity which is often depicted on their stamps. Check out the currently available items on Australia Post's web site at auspost.com.au.
