For 10 years, Starbelly School of Dance has pushed the edges of "raqs sharki," commonly referred to as belly dance, in both the Treasure Valley and the nation with compelling and unique dance art. Starting off as a show case of local professional dancers, the "Big Bad-Ass Belly Dance Show" has since taken on a narrative format and highlights the local professional performance troupe, the Starbelly Dancers, as they perform both traditional dances and creative "fusion belly dance" dance which has risen in popularity in the last 30 years. The show itself has received critical acclaim and has become a key piece in Starbelly School of Dance's mission to make belly dance seen as a high form of dance and art. A silent auction, both nights, also raises many for the scholarship program.

Starbelly School of Dance has been teaching the expressive, emotional and liberating art of belly dance in Boise for over 10 years. The school welcomes all sizes, shapes, ages & genders, and they practice loving kindness, body acceptance & celebrate what makes a person uniquely them in a warm and welcoming environment. Starbelly School of Dance is thrilled to share the joy and health benefits of dance with the community.

Starbelly received a grant from the City of Boise Department of Arts and History to offer a workshop and show on folkloric Middle Eastern dances, "Starbelly Arabic Folkloric Dance Celebration". It will be free for all ages and levels of dance ability and provide fun, easy lessons and background about debke, kahliji and other traditional dances. This celebration is on August and is the final stop of the "Idaho Raks" tour which will launch during Treefort Festival and travel through rural Idaho, sharing the joy of Raks Sharki with new audiences. Starbelly School of Dance has also received a grant from the Idaho Commission of the Arts.
