

About Community Cats

Community cats - also called feral - are unowned cats who live outdoors. They are the same species as domestic pet cats. However, because they are not well socialized to people, they are considered unadoptable.

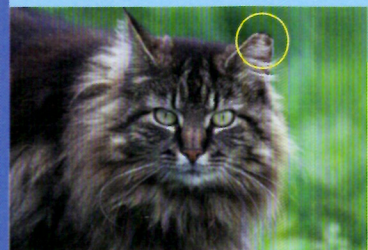
Why is it so important to Spay & Neuter?

Everyone can agree, we all want less homeless cats. This is how we get there. Studies show that an unfixed female cat can produce six to eight kittens annually. That means two cats can turn into 20 in just one year. Spaying and neutering are vital factors in reducing overpopulation. It's better for cats *and* for the community!

Why feed Community Cats?

A fixed, healthy cat colony works together as a team, guards their food and helps prevent new (unfixed) cats from moving into the area. When combined with spaying & neutering, this is much more humane than killing them and far more effective in reducing overpopulation.

Why are they missing the tip of their ear?

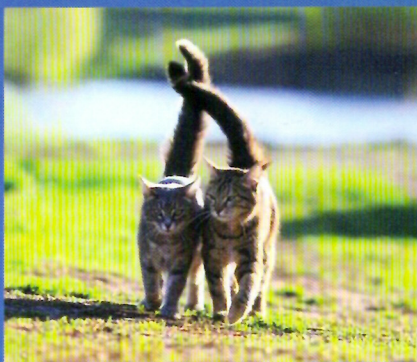


It's called an "ear-tip". It's how to easily identify a community cat who has been spayed or neutered.

If you see a cat with the tip of its ear missing, or a V-shaped notch, they are part of a managed colony and should be left where you found them.

Who Are We?

Save Maui Cats is a non-profit, 501(c)(3) organization dedicated to the homeless, hungry and forgotten cats of Maui. We are run solely by volunteers and 100% of your donation goes directly towards helping the island's struggling cats and kittens.



Through our humane TNRM Program (Trap-Neuter-Return-Manage) community cats are trapped, spayed or neutered, vaccinated and ear-tipped (the universal symbol of a sterilized cat.) Many socialized cats and kittens are adopted into loving homes. The rest are returned to their colony where a caretaker provides fresh food and water daily.

The Trap-Neuter-Return-Manage program is successfully being used in over 500 cities worldwide. On Maui, it's decreasing population growth (no more unwanted kittens) while improving the lives of the island's cats and their relationship with the community.

TNRM

Trap-Neuter-Return-Manage



Through our TNRM program, cats are humanely trapped, spayed/neutered, vaccinated, and ear-tipped. They are returned to their outdoor homes, known as colonies, where

they can live long healthy lives. In exchange, this colony of fixed and fed cats works together to help keep out unfixed cats, reducing over-population in the community. Since our TNRM program started on Maui, unwanted kitten population has dramatically declined.

Feed Community Cats in your neighborhood



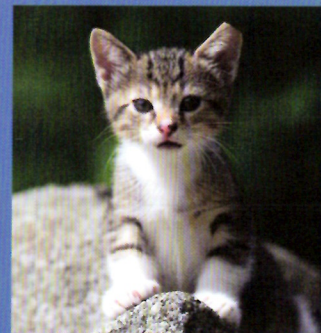
We are committed to helping provide fresh food and clean water to every fixed colony cat on Maui.

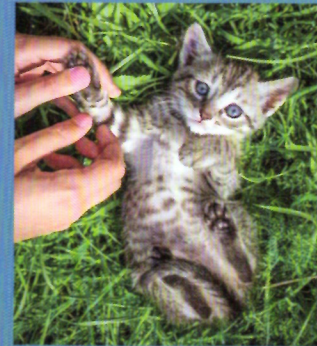

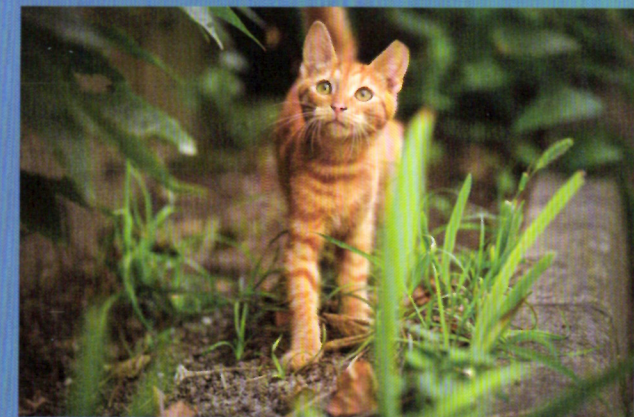
