

True Vine Restoration Transitional Housing

True Vine Restoration is a Christian nonprofit founded in 2025 that provides transition housing for women in the Farmington Missouri Area.

Our mission is to encourage women to grow in their walk with Christ, who is the True Vine and bear much fruit for His kingdom which in turn will allow each lady to learn how to become self-sufficient, financially independent, productive positive role models in their community.

Choosing to apply for our program which will provide you a place to call home when you find yourself in a position to take the next step in your life including being ready to continue to be pruned by Christ as He encourages your branch growth on His vine to bear much fruit for His kingdom and live life more abundantly.

John 15: 1-4 "I am the True Vine, and my Father is the gardener. He cuts off every branch of mine that does not produce fruit, and He prunes the branches that do bear fruit so they will produce even more. You have already been pruned and purified by the message I have given you. Remain in me, and I will remain in you. For a branch cannot produce fruit if it is severed from the vine, and you cannot be fruitful unless you remain in me."

John 10:10: "The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy; I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly."

Prov 3:34: Surely he scorns the scornful, but gives grace to the humble (those who give up self-importance) Having an abundant life comes when you abide and obey with humility. Transitions are not easy and could be considered pruning. Pruning is when God starts removing some damaged/broken parts of our lives to direct us/make room for us to be more fruitful. We need to be wise to understand that pruning is a part of life be it in our life personally or in our flower bed. Remembering He always prunes at the right time and is very mindful of exactly when and how much to prune. Trusting God in these times can be some of the hardest moments but can also be some of the most pivotal and rewarding ones.

We will walk alongside you to create an individualized transition plan, providing support, guidance and tool sets needed to meet your goals which will allow you to move onto the next chapter of your life, putting Him first and living life more abundantly.

If you are ready to take this next step in your life at True Vine Restoration, please read through our guidelines below and submit your application.

Rules and Guidelines for taking your next step at True Vine Restoration Transitional Housing

Residents are committing to a minimum of 90 days in our program. The average stay is 90 days to 1 year. Within the first week you will work with the directors and staff to create an individualized transition plan and will be held accountable to this plan. Everyone is beautifully different and thus everyone's plan will be also. You will meet with a director and/or staff member weekly to review the plan and discuss progress and make any updates that are needed as we know that many things in life, we plan out God may change our direction, and we need to be mindful and change our paths.

The first 30 days may look different for each resident, and this will be laid out in your initial transition plan, however you can expect the following:

- No overnight passes
- Not be allowed to just go out daily to just "kill-time",
- Be available for daily check-ins with directors and staff
- Be actively searching for employment
- Ensure that you have notified all parties necessary of your new address
- Obtain a phone to help meet goals on your transition plan

1. Residents are expected to participate in community service activities, daily bible study, weekly church services and fundraising activities.
2. Residents are encouraged to regularly attend addiction recovery meetings such as Celebrate Recovery
3. Residents will be required to be employed, unless physically unable to do so or receive disability.
4. Residents are not allowed to go to or work in bars, clubs, massage parlors or escort services at any time while you reside at True Vine and are encouraged to continue to abide by this rule after you leave the program.
5. Residents who are employed must turn in a work schedule weekly.
6. Residents who are not employed, will need to be available between 8:00 am to 4:00 pm and actively engaged in a job search and will provide proof at the end of each day unless your individual plan deems otherwise.
7. Residents must attend Life Skills classes as deemed necessary by their individualized plan. Budgeting is a mandatory class. These classes may be through True Vine Restoration Ministry, a local church, or other Christian organizations. You must agree to maintain a weekly budget. You are to provide documentation on all earnings and income. The documentation is pay stubs, letters, and bank statements. Also, keep receipts of all money spent.
8. Residents may not reside in the transitional home longer than their plan allows. Once you complete your transition plan, you will be ready to transition out of the home. If you refuse to complete the plan, or repeatedly miss deadlines on the plan's timeline, you will be removed from the program.
9. Residents must send notification anytime you leave and return home via the True Vine Group Chat. This includes going to the store at the end of the street.
10. Residents will allow Life 360 tracking on their cell phone and enable WiFi at all times to ensure better tracking
11. All guests must be on an approved list before visiting the first time. Overnight visits must be approved before each visit and at least 3 days in advance. Adult male visitors must be approved before each visit. Overnight visits by adult males will not be allowed. Approved visitors must abide by all rules while visiting.

12. True Vine has the right to limit visits and restrict visit activity in order to ensure Christian behavior and limit the temptation ie. You may not be allowed in a room alone with a visitor at any time nor are they allowed to have conversations with them in private.
13. Residents who are not married are not allowed to engage in any sexual or intimate relationships or behavior unbecoming of a Christian woman while in the program. Additionally, no sex toys or devices are allowed.
14. Residents with a car on the property or Residents who plan to drive one, must provide a copy of their insurance policy, registration and driver's license.
15. Residents need to always be clean and presentable. You need to dress appropriately, and this always applies as guests and directors and staff will be in and out of the home.
16. Residents are required to ensure proper hygiene at all times
17. All activities are to be quieted by 9:00 p.m. and stay quiet until 6:30 a.m. so as not to interfere with other residents' sleep. You are asked to keep TV, radio and phone conversation volume down to a minimum. When using video chat, you need to be using earbuds or in your room alone, to ensure others' privacy is upheld.
18. The curfew is 9:00 p.m. unless you are delayed due to work or approved function, this will help uphold the 9:00 p.m. quiet time.
19. No use and/or possession of alcohol, drugs or any mood-altering chemicals are allowed including prescription narcotics. Violation will result in immediate discharge. No refunds. The use of mental health medications are discouraged, however if you and your doctor deem it necessary you will provide medical documentation to that fact, prescription information and agree to have these locked up and available only to you by a director or staff member.
20. Residents agree to take a drug and alcohol test when requested. True Vine tests for all narcotics. Failure to submit to a drug screen is treated as a positive result and will result in discharge from the program. Residents that vape are subject to more frequent drug tests. All drug tests are at the resident's expense.
21. No physical or verbal threats will be tolerated. Any such instance will result in discharge. The same applies to stealing. (Charges may be filed.)
22. No weapons of any kind are allowed on the property, including knives not meant for use in the kitchen.
23. No smoking or vaping is allowed in the home or vehicles. Residents may smoke on the property however all discarded cigarettes are to be disposed of properly.
24. No pets allowed. No feeding or giving water to animals in and around the property except for birds.
25. Residents are to maintain a neat and orderly room and help ensure all common areas are also kept in that manner. Beds are to be always made. If you do not keep your living space clean or do not do your assigned house chores in a timely manner you are subject to a fine and/or blessing each day you do not meet these responsibilities.
26. Residents are to wash bedding at least every other week and ensure that no more than a regular laundry basket of laundry is dirty at any given time.
27. Residents are to ensure they are mindful of the use of the laundry facilities as these are shared.
28. Residents are expected to work together to ensure that all of the common areas of the house including the yard are maintained on a daily basis and ready for an inspection at any time. A weekly chore schedule will be created and posted.
29. Directors and staff maintain the right to do inspections daily and step-in and put an actionable plan in place if residents are not working together to maintain the property in an acceptable manner.
30. There is a television, laptop and internet provided. Residents are asked to refrain from certain types of programs you watch including but not limited to drug related programs. The house abides by a standard

of no X-rated items or loud music. These rules also apply to personal devices such as cell phones, tablets and computers.

31. Residents are asked to not use social media for at least the first 30 days and this could vary and will be discussed and agreed upon during your initial transition meetings
32. Residents are subject to searches including personal electronic devices at any time
33. Residents will be expected to pay to stay in the transition home an amount of not more than \$125 per week, details of when this including the due date will be all part of the individual transition plan. This helps offset the cost of the facility including but not limited to mortgage/rent, utilities including internet and normal property maintenance.
34. Residents are responsible for their own food and personal items including but not limited to laundry soap, toothpaste and shampoo.
35. Residents are expected to provide items to be shared in the home such as toilet paper, trash bags and other cleaning supplies.
36. Residents are not allowed to move or remove any furniture or change apartments or bedrooms without staff permission. No structural changes may be made. Should damage occur, please report immediately.
37. Residents are not allowed to tamper with the fire safety equipment including smoke detectors
38. Physical or Verbal Abuse is not allowed. If you are having difficulty with how to deal with any situation, True Vine directors and staff can help you learn better coping skills. Any resident witnessing abuse must report it immediately.
39. Residents are responsible for their own personal belongings, which must fit in the closet and drawer space provided in an orderly fashion. You may NOT bring any furniture, furnishings, or use True Vine property for storage in any way without prior approval.
40. If a resident knows someone is breaking the rules, they are to report it to staff immediately. If they do not, they will be deemed as guilty as the person breaking the rules.

I understand that if I violate any of these rules, I may be charged a fine, be dismissed from the program and the premises, be assessed a fine and potentially have criminal charges filed against me. We never want to do this, but we will if necessary for the health and safety of everyone involved, and to preserve the reputation of True Vine Restoration Ministries and of God.

By signing this document, I agree to hold True Vine Restoration Ministry, and any other parties associated with this program in any way whatsoever, singly or collectively, from any blame or liability for injury, harm, loss, inconvenience, or damage suffered or sustained as a result of participation in this program or in any activity associated within. I give permission for information to be released about me by or to any doctor, social worker, employer, landlord, shelter, agency, or any other person deemed necessary by True Vine Ministries to enter in or to continue to be a part of this transitional living program. All the information I have given is, to the best of my knowledge, true and complete. I understand that if any of the information given is found to be untrue, I will be dismissed from the transitional housing program.

Disclaimer:

All People are uniquely created by God, therefore, there can be exceptions made at the discretion of True Vine Restoration Ministry to meet individual needs. These rules may change any time during your stay, however you will be notified in writing of those changes.

If a resident has a positive drug test result, they will be given the opportunity to prove that they have not taken a narcotic by paying a non-refundable \$50.00 for the test to be sent to the lab. If a resident is not able to pay the \$50.00, they will be discharged from the program and will have to move out immediately, and under the guidelines of a positive drug screen all money is non-refundable.

Residents understand that True Vine Restoration, its directors, property management and staff will in no way be held responsible for the loss, damage or theft of property of any resident at any time.

Residents understand that True Vine Restoration, its directors, property management and staff will not be held responsible for any personal housing accidents or injuries of any kind.

Residents further waive any legal rights they may have under the law in connection with any personal accidents or injuries while on any True Vine Restoration property.

Residents understand that if they choose to ride with a resident or staff member to and from any destination True Vine Restoration, its directors, property management and staff are not responsible for any accidents or injuries.
