

## Starting Your Season by Joe White

As an old coach who has been around high school baseball my entire life, I thought I would share some thoughts. I have been asked many times how do you handle parents and players who are not happy about not making the team, or playing time. I believe that it all starts with WHY you are coaching. You have to ask yourself what is your purpose for coaching baseball at the high school level? We all want to win a state championship and have a program that is known as a winner. Those are all great goals. I really feel that if your program goals are cemented in developing kids to be good productive members of our society the rest will take care of itself.

I have always said that character wins. We have been very fortunate to win two state championships and I can honestly say that it was the character of our kids that won. If you look at what those kids are doing now in their lives they are still winning. They also won in the classroom first. I didn't spend too much time going over the ineligible list with those teams. Did we still have some parents and kids who were not happy on those teams and every other team I ever coached? You bet we did. So how did I handle that?

I started at our preseason parent meeting, which I highly encourage you to have if you don't already. It is a partnership with you and the parents and all parents want what is best for their kids, don't forget that. We have had some great parents in our program. You need to be up front and honest with all the parents at the meeting. I would tell the parents about our tryout process, and how we did it. I would show them the rubric that we used to grade the players, told them what we evaluated the players on and how we would do it, like throwing from the outfield and infield, hit with swing evaluation, and so on. The one thing that I thought was very important for parents to know was WHY we have to cut kids. We only have one field and we can only keep so many kids, we get no money from our district to pay for extra coaches, for extra balls, uniforms, and extra field space. I would tell them that it gets to be a liability issue with so many kids out there and one field. It is all the truth and it is why we have to cut. Let them know how hard it is on you and your coaches to cut kids. I would always tell them that I didn't get into this business to tell kids that they couldn't do things. I wanted them to know how hard it was on me and my coaches to do this.
