League Rules

Last Revised: February 2024

These are the Glen Cairn Ladies' Softball League (GCLSL) Rules, which have exceptions and modifications to Softball Canada Rules to accommodate the "Recreational Nature" of our league.

Softball Canada Rules are listed according to the 2024-25 Rulebook found online at <https://softball.ca/resources/2024reglements>. Exceptions that GCLSL does not follow are listed below, along with an explanation.

Any interpretation of the rules should be addressed by the Rules Committee and the GCLSL Executive.

GCLSL Rule 1: The Game		
1.1	League	GCLSL is classified as a Recreational Fast-Pitch League.
1.2	Team Captain	<p>There will be no team Coaches, the team Captain is responsible for the team.</p> <p>If a Captain must resign her position, the team will be required to elect a new Captain.</p> <p>Team Captain Responsibilities include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Encouraging Fair Play – make sure everyone sits and everyone plays equally throughout the year. • Setting up/taking down the Diamond – equally distributed between the teams and people
1.3	Regular and Playoff Games	<p>All Regular & Playoff games shall:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Commence at 6:15 pm and 8:00 pm, respectively. • No new innings can start after 7:50 pm and 9:35 pm, respectively. • Consist of 7 innings <p>In case of time limitations or inclement weather, a game is considered complete if 5 innings have been completed or after 4.5 innings if the home team is winning.</p> <p>All incomplete games will be rescheduled and played from the beginning as a new game.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Original line-up may be changed & all teammates will have equal opportunity to participate in a rescheduled game.
1.4	Delays in Games	<p>If there are circumstances that will cause a delay or stoppage of a game, (i.e. inclement weather, no official showing up, injury, lack of players) a decision will be made by the Officials and Captains of the scheduled game, if and when the game will resume.</p> <p>If a team has less than eight players including spares, the team will forfeit the game after the 15-minute grace period.</p> <p>If a team has eight players including spares, the game must be played. The game will start as soon as eight players are present.</p> <p>Upon arrival, late and/or spare players must be added to the bottom of the batting order.</p>
1.5	Mercy Rule	After the completion of the 5th inning, if a team is leading by more than 15 runs, the losing team will have the option of continuing or stopping the game.
1.6	10 Batter Inning	A team is allowed three (3) outs or a maximum of ten (10) batters per inning, whichever comes first. The announcement of the 10th batter must be communicated to the opposing team by the captain and/or the Scorekeeper and must be declared when the 10 th batter goes to bat. If the 10th batter is walked, the next batter in the order

		will go up. The inning cannot end with a walk, it needs to end with a third out or getting the ball and touching home plate.
1.7	Player Safety and Responsibilities	<p>Intoxication on the field, whether drugs or alcohol will not be tolerated.</p> <p>Smoking or vaping are not allowed in the dugout.</p> <p>Children are not allowed on the benches – only players are allowed in the dugout.</p> <p>Safety is a priority. If you see something, say something!</p>

	3.1.2	Coach	The team captain is responsible for their teams' actions on the field and for communicating with the umpire and the opposing team.

3.7 Scorers			
GCLSL Rule 3: Participants			
3.1	Spares	<p>If a team is unable to field a complete team by game time, they will be allowed to have a maximum of three (3) substitute/spare players. These spares must be currently registered players in the league. A team can call in a spare when:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">● It has less than nine (9) players● The main pitcher or catcher is absent or injured such that they cannot pitch or catch.● In either case, a team cannot use the same spare more than three (3) times during the regular season and playoffs, regardless of the position they are called in to play. The game will be forfeited if a team is caught using the same spare more than three (3) times.● No team player shall be displaced (including alternate pitchers and catchers) from her position by a spare pitcher or catcher when the team can field nine or more regular team members.	
3.2	Eligibility for Playoffs	<p>A player must play at least eight (8) games of the regular season to be eligible to play in the playoffs (the number of games may be waived by a vote of the Executive, in exceptional circumstances). For players joining the league partway through the season, playoff eligibility will be decided at the time of registration (no less than 60%).</p>	
3.3	Grace Period	<p>Players have a grace period of three complete innings to enter the game. The player must be placed at the bottom of the batting order. After the grace period, they can not enter the game.</p>	
3.4	No Show	<p>Any player who cannot continue to play for the season must inform her Captain so that a replacement can be found. Players must advise their captains if they will be away on holidays or unavailable for a game. Any player missing three (3) games without notifying her Captain will automatically be removed from the league.</p>	
3.6	Medical Leave	<p>If a player is injured or applies for medical leave of absence, the player will be granted leave of absence for one year and have the right to register as a returning player for the following season. If a player takes more than a year's leave, they will have to register as a new player when they return.</p>	

3.7	Game Protests	<p>A protest for a misinterpretation of a playing rule, applying an incorrect rule to a situation, or imposing an incorrect penalty, must be respectfully addressed by the captain to the umpire and opposing team Captain before:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • the next pitch, or • all infielders have left the infield, or • on the last play of the game before the umpire has left the field. <p>Protests based solely on judgment, or the accuracy of a call cannot be protested. All protests will then be submitted by the protesting Captain to the President and/or Vice-President for appropriate action and final decision.</p>

4.1	Rules for Pitchers	<p>Pitcher must have their front foot on the rubber at the start of the pitching motion and must stay within the width of the rubber and not pitch from the outer sides of the rubber.</p> <p>Secondary pitcher must pitch by the 4th inning.</p>

GCLSL Rule 5: Batting and Base Running		
5.1	Everyone bats	All players must be included in the batting rotation.
5.2	Batting as a Spare Player	Spare players must bat last in the batting order.
5.3	Asking for a Runner	A pinch runner must be requested by the batter prior to batting; OR a pinch runner can be requested due to injury incurred during the game. A pinch runner will be the last player out, NOT the last available runner.
5.4	2 Out - Catcher Runner	It is up to the Catcher’s discretion to use a Runner with two outs. It is NOT mandatory.
