League Updates

Executive Meeting Update

The Executive Committee met on February 10, 2025. Treasurer Liz Warren reported no January expenses aside from tarps, with upcoming costs including Google Drive and insurance.

The Banquet Committee rebranded the event as "The Final Inning" and will send a survey at the season start. Equipment needs include bases, pegs, bags, and ice packs. Fundraising raised \$1,500 from Music Trivia, with another event on March 1 featuring a 50-50 draw. Plans include a popcorn sale and Wine Survivor. Recruitment has 15+ new registrations, with outreach needed for past pitchers and a field/gym required for evaluations. The Rules Committee is reviewing the constitution, considering breaking it into policy documents, and will send the code of conduct before the season starts. Sponsorships secured include two platinum, one gold, five team, and one bronze. For the tournament, a BBQ is suggested for Saturday and a beer tent for Sunday finals.

Action items include reviewing rules, collecting sponsorships, finalizing jerseys, balancing equipment bags, and notifying pitchers/catchers.

Softball Tip: Improve Your Throwing Accuracy

Focus on a strong, balanced stance before making your throw. Step toward your target with your glove-side foot, keep your elbow up and follow through with your arm and body. A smooth, controlled motion will help with both accuracy and power. Practice with a target to refine your aim!

GCLSL Fun Facts

For years, pitchers worldwide have aimed to reach the elusive 100 mph fastball, a milestone once thought to be unattainable. While many pitchers today consistently throw fastballs around 95 mph, it wasn't until 1974 that Nolan Ryan officially surpassed the 100 mph barrier.

Currently, Aroldis Chapman holds the record for the fastest-recorded pitch, clocking in at 105.1 mph while playing for the Cincinnati Reds. However, accurately measuring pitch speeds in earlier eras was challenging, and some players have claimed to have thrown even faster, though no official evidence exists to confirm these claims.

In recent years, pitch speeds have steadily increased, with over twenty pitchers now achieving fastballs exceeding 101 mph.
