The Real MVP: Your Sports Bra

GCLSL Rules Corner

Understanding the 10-Batter Inning Rule

The "10th batter" rule refers to the final batter allowed in an inning, unless three outs happen first. This rule means a team can only send a maximum of 10 batters to the plate in a single inning. Once the 10th batter comes up, the batting team must announce it to the other team.

If the 10th batter is:

- Out: the inning ends
- Gets a hit: play continues until the ball is returned and touches home plate
- Walked: the next batter hits. Inning cannot end on a walk.

This rule helps keep games on schedule and gives both teams a fair shot at fielding and batting each inning.
