Dear Parish Family:

We read in the Book of Ecclesiastes: "For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven..." (Ecclesiastes 3:1) This phrase seems appropriate as I share with you the "comings and goings" of Deacons in our Parish in the coming months.

Dick Bunting was ordained a Vocational Deacon along with Barry Neville in May of 2013. He spent most of his ordained life with us, with a sojourn at Church of Holy Spirit in Ocean City. He had a conversation with me awhile ago and shared with me his desire to retire from active ministry. He has continued to serve us, but will retire on Sunday, 18 October. I thank him for his many years of friendship and service to our Parish. He will be joining his wife Ellen in the pews of St. Paul's – so he begins a new season of his life and ministry.

Andrew Cropper will be ordained as a Transitional Deacon on Sunday, 1 November. The Bishop is giving the people in the ordination process a time to minister as a Deacon in their sponsoring Parish. Andrew will join us the Sunday after Dick's retirement and will stay until Christmas. It will be nice to see how Andrew has grown into his calling in his time away from us. We welcome him back for a season.

Chris Sabas will be ordained on Sunday, 11 October at St. Alban's in Salisbury. It was my hope that she would return to us as a Deacon, but a different opportunity has arisen for her as the Bishop is assigning her to be Deacon in Residence at St. Andrew's in Princess Anne. Her last Sunday with us will be on 4 October. Although our Current Situation did not allow her to be with us in worshiping Live stream, we have had a wonderful time with her at a number of worship services and through the weekly Bible Study. She will be missed.

You will find more information on Dick, Andrew, and Chris in this newsletter. We will be joined by Alisha King in the beginning of 2021. She is being ordained at the same service as Chris Sabas, since they were both sponsored by St. Alban's. She will continue at St. Alban's until the end of the year. We will share more information on Alisha in our next newsletter.

St. Paul's will be a busy place with the changing of the seasons for these very dedicated servants of our Lord Jesus Christ. I look forward to all of their "comings and goings". Through it all we will continue to be blessed.


On July 31, 2020 I turned 75 years old. I thought me 75. No wonder my joints are so sore making it hard for me to walk.

Cropper Ordination set for Sunday, November 1st.

Greetings St. Paul's! I am writing you with an update on my discernment/journey to Ordination in the Diocese of Easton. Since September 2019, I have been assigned as the intern at All Hallows in Snow Hill under the direction of Rev. Chuck Hatfield. I have been blessed by the support that Rev's Chuck and Adele and the members of All Hallows have provided to me as I have continued my training for the Diaconate. My Ordination to the Sacred Orders of Deacons will be taking place Sunday, November 1st (All Saint's Day) at 3pm at St. Paul's. Due to the current covid-19 situation, the service will only be open to ten (10) people. The service will be live streamed on the St. Paul's Facebook page. You are invited to watch the service at that time online.

I will be Ordained as a
Transitional Deacon as I continue
my discernment/journey to the
Priesthood in the Episcopal Church.
This transitional statue means that I
will be serving as a Deacon between
six months to one year prior to being
Ordained a Priest in the Diocese of
Easton. During this time, I will be
gaining more training and
discernment from clergy in the
Diocese to prepare me for the

As Deacon Dick is set to retire on Sunday, October 18th, I will be returning to St. Paul's to assist Father Moyer with services as a Deacon starting on Sunday, October 25th to Christmas. Bishop Marray is giving the Ordinands the opportunity as our first steps into Ordained Ministry coming back to serve our sponsoring parish for a short time. And I will be returning to All Hollows' in Snow Hill Sunday after Christmas, December 27th.

I ask for your continued prayers and support as I continue on this journey to Ordination to become a Deacon and then to the Priesthood.

Greek philosopher Heraclitus is credited with penning 'the only constant in life is change.' All of us can certainly relate to that sentiment, especially this year. I am of course disappointed that my internship with St Paul's was affected to the extent that it was in light of these Covid-19 times. Throughout the lockdown, and initial re-opening phases, I had a 91- yearold household member in the highrisk group, with the various doctors and health care professionals advising us to remain home. While not assisting with the weekly live stream services. I was able to maintain a connection to the parish via the weekly virtual Bible study gatherings. I cannot find the words to express my appreciation and deepest gratitude for the fellowship and discussions. I found myself missing the group the week my family member died and could not wait to resume the sessions. Now that I do not have to maintain a more restrictive Covid-19 protocol, I eagerly returned to the parish to assist with worship services. Anticipating being placed with St Paul's after my ordination, I was looking forward to being as active as possible within the parish community, and getting to know more of you. The only constant in life is change. Due to an unexpected

forthcoming vacancy at St. Andrews, Princess Anne, with Father Rob Lawes accepting another call in New Jersey, the Bishop needed to juggle anticipated placements among several of us in the deacon cohort. He asked me if I was open to being placed at St Andrews for the next little while as the 'Deacon in Residence.' Deacons are to be transitory, serving Christ and the church, as the Spirit directs. I said yes. I will begin my time with them after my ordination on October 11th. St Paul's will remain in my heart and prayers. I have enjoyed the opportunities provided to me throughout the past several months. I will miss those of whom who have been a part of my ministry since I arrived to the parish. We may be troubled, yet not distressed; perplexed but not in despair (see 2 Corinthians 4: 8-18 NRSV). The grace of the Lord Jesus be with you. My love be with all of you in Christ Jesus (1 Corinthians 16: 23-24 NRSV).

Fr. Michael has been invited to attend the ordination of our Intern, Chris Sabas on Sunday, 11 October, at St. Alban's in Salisbury. It is scheduled at 9:30 a.m., which makes it impossible for him to celebrate a live or "in-person" Eucharist that day. Instead, we will post a prerecorded service.

Andrew Cropper will be ordained at 3:00 p.m. on Sunday, 1 November. We will be pre-recording of a service for the morning. We will be Live streaming the ordination (to the best of our ability – we hope to have new equipment by that time). We will send out more information as we get closer to that Sunday.

We will be pre-recording our annual All Souls' Day Requiem and posting it on Facebook on the 2 November. Because of our guidelines, we can only have one "inperson" service per week in the church. This makes it impossible to have the All Souls' service with a congregation present. Please see the information elsewhere in the newsletter to submit the names of your departed loved ones to be remembered at the Requiem.



We will have all the usual parts of the program including some surprises.


To sign up for the tea, please send your email address to Carol Vaughan at carolv1962@yahoo.com to reserve your spot.
