
# **VBS**

# Outreach

Worcester goes Purple is an awareness project to engage the community in preventing

substance abuse and promoting healthy life choices. The project is inspired by the THP Project Purple, an initiative of The Herren Project, a 50`(c)3 non-profit foundation established by former NBA basketball player, Chris Herren, that assists individuals and families struggling with addiction.

WGP is an initiative supported by Worcester County Public Schools, Worcester County Health Department, Atlantic General Hospital and the Worcester County Sheriff's Office. WGP welcomes partnerships with community organizations and businesses who support their mission. Funding is being made possible through the participating agencies, the Heroin and Opioid Policy Development Grant, and donations from the generous Worcester County Community.

In September the Church Mouse will be decorated with purple to promote awareness to prevent substance abuse and to promote healthy choices. Our recent Outreach for Spring: GOLD, Greater Berlin Minority scholarship, Food for the Poor, Jesse Klump Memorial Fund, Operation We Care, Honor Flight, Diocese of Easton, Meals on Wheels and Camp Agape.
