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# WHAT TO DO WHEN YOU WANT TO QUIT

Have you ever felt like quitting? It would be a rare person who has never felt that urge. There is a story in the Bible about a man who felt like quitting. Jeremiah wanted to quit, as recorded in Chapters nine and twenty of the book that bears his name. He developed a bad attitude toward people and even accused God of lying to him. He wanted to quit, but found out he couldn't.

He had a feeling he called a "fire in my bones." Yet, he found what all great people do he rallied because he learned how to get back "up" when he was "down." Life is full of "ups" and "downs." There are "highs" and "lows" in every life. But, what are we to do about that?

One of the first things we must realize is that "downs" are normal. They come to everyone and we are told they will in the Bible, 1 Peter 4:12-19. We must understand that we are not unique. We live in a negative world filled with problems. It is not the low times that are the real problems, but it is our reaction to them.

Next we have to realize the bad times are not the whole story. We don't have all "downs" all the time. They are not permanent so "Let us not become

weary in doing good for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up," Gal. 6:9.

Also know that down times make life interesting. How do we know when times are good if we never experience bad times? That may sound trite but give it some thought. Looking back we might see that victories are appreciated most by us because we know what it is to have lost. Spoiled children are those who have been sheltered from disappointment, like the "down" of being told "no," and their little hearts are broken.

One of the most idiotic recent practices is "everyone gets a trophy." I'm sure you have heard the theory that we have to protect those who lose by cheapening the reward for winning. If everyone

gets a trophy then two bad things happen. First, the winner who labored receives recognition for his effort gets no more than those who just showed up. The second bad thing is all others are robded of the lesson of life that there is "no free lunch." This later is a lesson that those have excelled in life learned early. "Down" is no fun, but it can, and usually does lead to a life that is "up." So, what do we do rather than quit?

# WHAT TO DO WITH "I QUIT" TIMES

Accept temporary heartbreaks. Accept them as you do day and the night. You can handle it, the down times are not the whole book, simply a page or two in the book. Bad times are not fatal, unless you surrender to them.

Down times do not stop success. We have all read about successful people in sports, music, business and in the Bible. We hear of people who celebrate 50 years of marriage. When asked how they made it that long they typically say, "We had our bad times, but we just hung in there," and then they chuckle. They just plowed through.

We can and must choose to look "up" even in bad times. We may ask, "How do you feel?" when the better question is "How do you choose to feel?" Life is what we choose it to be. We can't keep bad things from happening. But, by the same token we can't gripe about conditions in the world and blame those conditions on our attitude.

## IT IS POSSIBLE TO SET OURSELVES UP FOR RESIGNATION

We set our minds on this world only. Colossians 3:2 states it "Set your minds on things above, not on earthly things." In this world we will meet with rejection, disrespect, and all other forms of heartbreak. God had one Son who was without sin, but He was also a "man of sorrows" Isaiah 53:1. He met with resistance at nearly every turn, but we have no record of Him considering quitting. For which we all praise God! (continued)

## WHAT TO DO WHEN YOU WANT TO QUIT

Retreating is not normally a good idea, except when the retreating is to our refuge in God. In Nahum 1:7 is our instruction, "The Lord is good, a refuge in times of trouble. He cares for those who trust in him..." When we become overwhelmed with too much pressure, responsibility, opposition or just life here on earth, we can depend on Him. He cares about us and He repays our trust positive, long term deliverance.

Regardless of what engulfs us if we do not over-react but wait on Him, it will work for good. That's the promise of Romans 8:28, "And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose." It does not say all things are good, but in all things, He will work it for our good. Looking back I believe we can all see things that looked dark became light for us in the end.

He sees to it that our troubles strengthen rather than destroy us. In 2 Corinthians 4:8-9 Paul expressed his life of trouble this way "We are hard pressed on every side, but not crushed; perplexed, but not in despair; persecuted, but not abandoned; struck down, but not destroyed." If it doesn't kill us, it will strengthen us. And if it is so severe that our lives are taken, we have a home with our Lord Jesus Christ.

God's words to Isaiah should comfort us as well, He told the prophet, "So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you; I will uphold you with my righteous right hand," Isaiah 41:10.

When things go wrong as they sometimes will, When the road you're trudging seems all up hill. When the funds are low and the debts are high and you want to smile, but you have to sigh. When care is pressing your down a bit, rest if you must, but don't you quit.

Life is strange with its twists and turns, as everyone of us sometimes learns. And many a failure comes about when he might have won had he stuck it out. Don't give up thought the pace seems slow, you may succeed with another blow.

Success is failure turned inside out, the silver tint of the clouds of doubt. And you never can tell just how close you are, it may be near when seems so far. So stick to the fight when you're hardest hit. It's when things seem worst that you must not quit.

#### THE RESTORATION MOVEMENT

We just have not united churches as we pledge to stand on Biblical truths. It is noted that in the beginning the organizers had a declaration that they wanted to be "Christians Only". This was to emphasize that we were not going to follow traditions but only allow scripture to dictate what was taught and trusted in our assemblies and individual lives.

Today we are hearing from all points of the spiritual compass that we need to put our Biblical teaching aside, believe what you would like, but we should stand together to fight the fiery darts of the devil. Yes, we probably could be more Effective in our stand for Christianity if we worked together but that does not win souls. Did the Father not inspire writers of scripture to record *His plan* of salvation and how dare us just push it aside to prove some point and appear as united with people who make a mockery of what is written in those scriptures. TEXT: Matthew 5:1-12

INTRO:: Most Bible students recognize this section of Scripture as the Beatitudes, that section which has the repeated two words, "Blessed are" as Jesus tells us how to be blessed. I will be breaking the rules of homiletics that allows the text to speak to us. Instead of reading how we will be blessed, I want to reverse the process and examine how we can create barriers to happiness. It's much like the boy who complained about his lunch being the same every day by saying "Apple butter, always apple butter, I'd like a change to peanut butter sandwiches." His friend said, "Why don't you tell your mother to make peanut butter?" The first boy said, "I make my own lunch." We often created our own barriers to happiness. How is that?

#### A COVETOUS SPIRIT - ACHAN, Jos. 7 I.

- A. We are taught in the Ten Commandments "thou shalt not covet"
- B. Many of us think or say "I wish I had..." It's alright to wish, but not to want what is not ours.
- C. That turns our mind from our divine purpose to things...leading to, jealousy, theft, even hating others...robs us of happiness with what we have.

#### II. BY HAVING A REBELLIOUS SPIRIT

- A. God wanted Jonah to "Go," Jonah said "No."
- "Blessed are they who keep my commands," Rev.22:14
- C. I've heard some say "I don't care what the Bible says," only to see regret and tears...robbed of joy.

#### BY HAVING A WORLDLY SPIRIT. -III.

- A. Demas was charmed by preacher Paul, not by Jesus

Study Number One Hundred Thirty-five - Some Principles of Encouragement

In the past editions of BARN-A-BOOK I have shared my thoughts on some passages of Scriptures that deal with the subject of encouragement. In this paper I would like to just share some random thoughts about encouragement as well as discouragement that can't be cured by medication, alcohol or any human activity. It may be true that those things may cover the symptom of discouragement, or give one a temporary boldness, but they are not cures.

Discouragement is an attack of Satan who uses discouragement to draw individuals away from God. I believe the Lord has provided ways to fight back against the Devil and perhaps in the process you will become able to share the gift of encouragement with people around you that you meet every day. This is not a systematic study on the subject but the principles will assist you and prepare you to help others.

- Your past and present do not have to and need not continue into your future. A man was asked, "Have you lived here all your life?" To which he replied, "Not yet." Whatever reality that is happening in your life today does not have to be the reality tomorrow. If you are burdened by a load of guilt, hurt, or anger, you can receive forgiveness. Don't wallow in the mud puddle of confusion. God is full of compassion, wisdom and guidance. Spend time and conversation with Christian friends.
- God's love is unconditional and absolute. While it is true that salvation and blessings come from surrender to the will of God and obedience to the Gospel, God loves sinners without condition and His love is complete. If there is one place on earth we should all feel at rest and peace it is home. It is there we know we are accepted and loved and there should be no dread in returning there if we have wondered away. Though some homes do not provide this peace and protection, God always does. He loves you because He created you and because He chooses to love you, now and every moment of your life. "Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall trouble or hardship or persecution or famine or nakedness or danger or sword? No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us," Romans 8:35, 37.
- No matter what sin you have committed, you can be cleansed by God. No matter how much guilt and shame you feel, you can be forgiven and have a newness of spirit. God's Word is absolute just as His love is absolute. The assurance of God's ever-present and free offer of forgiveness is one of the most encouraging truths that a person can ever receive or share with others. His forgiveness is offered to all, but it must be actively received. That's what the Bible is all about. God's offer of forgiveness is based upon the sacrificial death of Jesus Christ.
  - The supreme and definitive sacrifice for sin was made when God offered His own Son, Jesus Christ, on the cross. Jesus died on the cross, shedding His blood as a sin-free "lamb" without blemish taking on Himself the sins of the world. His sacrificial death eliminated the need for any further sacrifice. "Just as Moses lifted up the snake in the desert, so the Son of Man must be lifted up, that everyone who believes in him may have eternal life," John 3:14-15.
- God takes away the old and gives the new. When we receive God's forgiveness, we are given a completely new nature. Our old spiritual nature with all its desires for self and sin is cleansed from us. Our hearts are made new, and our new spiritual nature has a desire for God. This is referred to by our Savior as being "born again." What Christians need to know is that when we sin after our salvation, there is a provision. That is found in 1 John 1:9, "If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness." We can be renewed again.

"Do not be deceived: God cannot be mocked. A man reaps what he sows.

The one who sows to please his sinful nature, from that nature will reap
destruction; the one that sows to please the Spirit, from the Spirit will
reap eternal life. Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper
time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up. Therefore, as we have opportunity,
let us do good to all people, especially to those who belong to the family
of believers," Galatians 6:7-10

The law of sowing and reaping is unbreakable. The more one sows the more one will reap. A random act of kindness will have its reward, but it cannot compare with the joy of making encouragement a way of life. Those who encourage bountifully are blessed in the same manner.

- **CONTAGIOUSNESS** When people respond in kind to human goodness, there is usually more than one beneficiary. The law of reciprocity starts a chain reaction that touches the lives of countless people. Like tossing a rock into a pond, the ripples of encouragement are far reaching. It is interesting to just think of how one act of compassion will multiply itself over and over again. Kindness is contagious, and unsuspecting souls are encouraged every day as a result of something that happened somewhere else between two people unknown to them directly. Who knows where love will lead? Every day, Christians find encouragement in an event that took place 2,000 years ago.
- **CONTENTMENT** Finally, giving produces the blessing of inner-peace. It just makes a person feel better. It is a blessing to just think about the pleasure God takes in witnessing His children encouraging others through good deeds. Still, helping others live more courageously is its own reward. Human beings were created with a need to make a difference in other people's lives, and encouragement fills that innate desire.

It is hard for an individual to think about his own problems while trying to minister to someone else. There is no room for discouragement in a mind filled with concern for improving the well-being of another. This alone should be sufficient incentive not to miss another opportunity to encourage.

Christian is more than sound doctrine and pious words. It is laying up treasures in heaven by investing in others' lives here on earth. This is something that can be done anywhere, anytime, by anyone. It is not necessary to be wealthy, brilliant, powerful or famous. All that is needed is a caring heart.

Encouraging others is one of the safest investments a person can make. No one can take away the grateful smiles and words of appreciation that are accumulated over a lifetime and stored in the heart. Some people collect coins, or spoons, or stamps or dolls, but an encourager collects something much more precious. What could be more satisfying than saving up memories of playing a small but significant role in providing the supportive context people need for making lasting positive changes in lives?

No one admires an indolent, miserly or gluttonous person. Those who are hungry for power or pleasure are pitied for their skewed sense of values. Those who are most respected are always the ones who make it their life's ambition to contribute to the happiness and well-being of those whose lives they touch.

# LEARN ING with Larry

It was the month of December 1984 that my life changed. There was a preacher who kept coming to my house and pestering me about the Lord. His name was Hoyt Allen. He went to be with the Lord May 12<sup>th</sup>. Hoyt spent countless hours sharing the Word of God with me. He and his wife Shara were like parent to me. Hoyt became my mentor. He led many to Jesus and I'm blessed to be one of them.

From February to December 1984 I listened to the gospel. In December after Hoyt preached I began to experience emotions I never had before. I then began to feel guilt and shame for my sin and knew I had to make a decision about who would rule my life. I know that I was experiencing the power of conviction brought by the Holy Spirit.

I know what the people felt when Peter preached that first gospel message on the day of Pentecost, Acts 2:36-37, "Therefore let all Israel be assured of this: God has made this Jesus, whom you crucified both Lord and Christ. When the people heard this, they were cut to the heart and said to Peter and the other apostles, brothers what shall we do?" So I did what the 3000 did, I surrendered in repentance to the Lord Jesus and was baptized into Christ for the forgiveness of my sins and the gift of the Holy Spirit.

Hoyt shared the word of life with me, but it was the powerful Holy Spirit that put that deep conviction in my heart that got me to want to change. In 1 Thess. 1:4-5 it states, "For we know brothers loved by, that he has chosen you because our gospel came to you not simply with words, but also with power, with the Holy Spirit and deep conviction."

The Greek word for conviction is also the same word reprove, ELENCHO. This word suggests putting the convicted person to shame. Muck like hearing the verdict of the jury: "guilty." I knew I was guilty, it's like being caught with your hand in the cookie jar or the teacher seeing you as you look over the shoulder of your classmate to get the answer on a test.

Have you ever been driving down the highway and see flashing lights behind you and realizing you're going 75 in a 55-mile zone? You're caught, you're guilty. I praise God that my guilt of sin was exposed. I am a child of God today because Hoyt Allen shared the word of life with me, and the Holy Spirit convicted me of my guilt.

The Holy Spirit convicted me of my guilt. The Spirit's part is not just to condemn us in our sin, but also to convince us that we need Jesus desperately. Before Jesus was to go to the cross, He shared this with His disciples and with us. In John 16:5-11 "Now I am going to Him who sent me, yet none of you asked me, "Where are you going?" Because I have said these things you're filled with grief. But I tell you the truth it is for your good that I am going away. Unless I go away, the Counselor will not come to you; but if I go, I will send Him to you. When He comes, He will convict the world of guilt in regard to sin and righteousness and judgement; In regard to sin, because men do not believe in me; in regard to righteousness, because I am going to the Father, where you can see me no longer, and in regard to judgment, because the prince of this world stands condemned."

I've heard preachers say that the word of God works through the Holy Spirit to pierce the heart of souls to bring them to Christ. I am glad that Hoyt shared the word with me, and I was pronounced guilty. Then I responded in complete surrender to the Lord Jesus Christ.

## PAUSE WITH DAWES

In the latter part of the 19th century, Milton Wright was a Bishop in the Church Of The United Brethren. He attended the annual convention of the denomination one year. At that meeting, one of the leaders stood and shared his vision for the church and for society at large. He told the preachers and others in attendance that he believed that someday men would fly from place to place rather than just travel on horseback. This was too great a concept for Bishop Wright. He could not accept this and so he stood and in anger he protested: "Heresy, Heresy! Men will never fly because flight is reserved for the angels. If God had wanted men to fly, He would have given them wings." He just could not accept or grasp the vision of the speaker.
