FROM FR. JOE

My dear friends, in the Gospel today Jesus goes to His native place, his home town. There, He is questioned by the people because they know Him... or they think they know Him. They are deprived of experiencing the amazing things that Jesus can do because of their preconceived notions of His limitations. He is just the carpenter's son after all. The Gospel tells us that Jesus was unable to perform any mighty deeds there because of their lack of faith.

It is good to question. God has given us intelligence so that we can grow in wisdom. However, when we question, there are good and bad ways to do it. For example, the first question they ask is "Where did this man get all this?" They are asking this question because they believe that Jesus is merely a man. They know Him because He grew up among them. They were firsthand witnesses to His childhood and adolescence, so they presume to know Him fully. They are not asking the question with the intention of discovering an answer. Rather, they are using the question as a rhetorical way of denying who Jesus is and challenging His authority.

Would it not have been better for them to ask this same question with a true desire to discover the answer. Have we not wondered the same thing? How did Jesus come to know all that He knows? Where did He come to the knowledge and convictions that He has regarding the Father in heaven? In fact, what did Jesus know about God, or what would happen to Him at Calvary? We can ask these questions in order to learn more about the mystery of Jesus and our relationship with Him. Our questions need not undermine or challenge the divine authority of Jesus. Instead, they can lead to us to deeper faith and knowledge of God.

In the end, the people of today's Gospel "take offense at Him," but why? They believe that He is making something of Himself that He is not. They do not believe in Him, so they justify their unbelief by accusing Him of being a blasphemer and a mere man who was making Himself out to be God. In fact, this is the offense for which Jesus would ultimately be crucified. The real tragedy for this Gospel is that Jesus had come for their sake. He went back to His "native place" so that He could enrich them with His blessing and heal them by His miraculous works. In the end, He cannot because of their lack of faith.

Today, Jesus comes into our midst under the appearance of bread and wine. It is natural for us to question such an extraordinary truth. Just as it was natural for the contemporaries of Jesus to question that what appeared to be just a man could actually be the Living God walking among them. When we question the True Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist, may we learn from the people of today's Gospel and ask our questions with a desire to understand and believe rather than to challenge

and deny the mysteries of God!

Outreach to the Poor Team


