FROM FR. JOE

My dear friends, eternity is a long time! I wonder if we can adequately grasp the notion of "forever". God exists out of time, but there does not exist a time when He has not loved us. In today's Scripture readings, we see a scene that is very familiar to us in the multiplication of the loaves. But this scene from the Gospel is coupled with the reading from 2nd Kings when a similar miraculous event occurs in Elisha's time. He lived in the 9th Century BC. That's almost 3,000 years ago. But what is that in the context of eternity?

God has loved us even from when we existed only in His divine plan. He will love us for all of eternity. The Lord shows His love for us in all that He does. The multiplication of the loaves in the Gospel is a reminder to all of us of the Lord's desire to feed and nourish us, to see that we are satisfied and happy. This is not new! He lavished the fruits of the earth upon Adam and Eve in the garden from the very beginning of our human existence. How can we imagine, after all He has continually done for us over the ages from our creation until now, that His love might waver or falter. Never.

We can take comfort this weekend in the love that God has for us. St. Paul, in our second reading urges us to "live in a manner worthy of the call" that we have received. The call to which He is referring is God's call and invitation to all of us that we claim the gift of eternal life He has offered. We can do this by dedicating our lives to Him. There really is no other way. Our life in Christ is a life that demands our full and total dedication. But it is a life that is lived basking in the warmth and power of God's love for us. He truly loves us!


How can we live in a manner worthy of that love? Jesus has come to show us the way. The people believe Him to be the Prophet (Elijah) who was to come back as a herald of the Messiah. With hindsight and Jesus' own explanation, we know John the Baptist to be that herald. Jesus is not the herald, but the one whose coming the herald announces. He comes to redeem us, but also to show us what redeemed life is meant to look like.

In order for us to fully understand what it means to "live in a manner worthy of the call," we look to Jesus. We can see, through the words of the Holy Gospels, how to live our life, how to treat one another, how to love God, how to pray, how to serve, how to boldly proclaim and share our faith, how to sacrifice, and even how to die. Our God has loved us from before the dawn of time. But He has come to us, in Jesus, in time,

to show us how we can share in that love and live it to the full in imitation of Jesus.
