

FROM FR. JOE

My dear friends, I am excited to be in the final stages of putting together a new pilgrimage from St. Michael's. With our first pilgrim journey last year to Tuscany focused on four Dominican saints and their spirituality being such a success, I am eager to venture out again! This expedition will take us to the Czech Republic, Germany, and Austria. I am calling the pilgrimage "St. Stephen's Crown."

This does not refer to the actual crown worn by the king, but to the myriad of virtues that St. Stephen of Hungary admonished his son, Prince Emeric, to embody in his own rule once Stephen had passed away. In fact, the "Admonitions" of St. Stephen constitute the first part of the Hungarian historical legal code. He wrote to his son:

My dearest son, if you desire to honor the royal crown, I advise, I counsel, I urge you above all things to maintain the Catholic and Apostolic faith with such diligence and care that you may be an example for all those placed under you by God and that all the clergy may rightly call you a man of true Christian profession.

Be merciful to all who are suffering violence, keeping always in your heart the example of the Lord who said: "I desire mercy and not sacrifice." Be patient with everyone, not only with the powerful, but also with the weak. Finally be strong lest prosperity lift you up too much or adversity cast you down. Be humble in this life that God may raise you up in the next. Be truly moderate and do not punish or condemn anyone immoderately. Be gentle so that you may never oppose justice. Be honorable so that you never voluntarily bring disgrace upon anyone. Be chaste so that you may avoid all the foulness that so resembles the pangs of death.

Pray so that it expels idleness and sloth from you, and confers upon you the combined aid of all virtues in their entirety, enabling you to vanguish all enemies, both apparent and hidden.

So, with St. Stephen of Hungary and many other Catholic saints, we will journey to Regensburg, Prague, Salzburg, Vienna, Altötting, Munich, Oberammergau, and other beautiful sites in Central Europe. I went, myself, to reconnoiter the destinations to make sure that we can comfortably and easily navigate the journey. Even if you have been to these places before, I encourage you to consider making the journey with our group as you will see them from the perspective of our Catholic tradition. We will see the Catholic side of these places and, hopefully, walk away from the expedition more mature in our faith and better prepared to live out the virtues that St. Stephen encouraged his son to embody as the future king.

Brochures will be available in the coming weeks along with detailed and specific presentations by me describing the journey and our itinerary. Travel broadens our understanding of the world and the faith in so many

ways. I hope that you will consider coming with me to these holy and historic centers of faith and culture!
