

FROM FR. JOE

My dear friends, Jesus invites us to the banquet of His Body and Blood with the following words: "Whoever eats this bread will live forever!" Eternal life! It can be so difficult to believe in such a reality when we are faced with the daily and seemingly constant challenges of surviving our earthly life. Illness, disease, aging, frailty, aches, and pains all remind us of our mortality. Yet, Jesus invites us to look forward to a living of life without any of those woes.

It is the statement above coupled with the invitation that we drink His Blood, that gave credence to the notion of the Holy Grail... as if the chalice were the important part! How ironic that people would venture forth on pointless quests to uncover the cup used by Jesus at the Last Supper thinking that the cup was the entity that had the power to preserve life forever. Though the quest for the Grail finds its most significant origins in the legends of King Arthur, it serves as a metaphor for our desire to preserve our earthly life.

The irony is that the true reality that grants eternal life was immediately accessible to them in every Catholic church at every altar, in every tabernacle. What a loss to spend so much time and effort searching for something that was to be found so near! We cannot fall into the same trap. We may not be on a quest for the Holy Grail, but we can still run away from God and His plan for us.

Sadly, their hope was to preserve their earthly life, but what then of life in heaven? We are nourished by the Eucharist for eternal life. This heavenly food brings us life, even now. Though it may not take away our pains and sufferings, the Eucharist is the gift of Jesus to each one of us that sustains us along the way. Do we recognize the strength that comes to us from this Great Sacrament? Do we truly rely upon it?

How do we receive Jesus in the Eucharist? Imagine a world in which normal food and drink provided no nourishment and failed to quench our thirst or ease our hunger. If we, as a result, were effectively starving, desperate for food that would relieve our appetite. Then Jesus comes and offers us such a food. Imagine the lines and, sadly, even the fights that would likely ensue as people fought to obtain the food that would satisfy. Scheming and conniving, many would likely do anything possible to eat and be satisfied.

Compare that to our reception of Holy Communion. No other food can nourish us as the Eucharist does. It satiates our spiritual hunger as no other food can. How can we receive the Heavenly Bread casually or with complacence? We cannot. As we gather together once again for this Great Feast that is the Mass, I encourage you to look deep within to discover the spiritual hunger that only Jesus can satisfy and to recognize in the gift of the Eucharist, the amazing food upon which we feast!


