



FROM FR. JOE

My dear friends, today we come to the conclusion of John 6 in our Gospel reading. Peter proclaims, on behalf of all those present, that Jesus is the Christ, the Holy One of God. The whole encounter and discourse on the Bread of Life that we have been hearing for the past few weeks leads to a decision point. The followers of Jesus must decide whether they will put their trust in Him and remain or return to their former life.

A similar choice is faced by the followers of Joshua (whose Hebrew name is identical to that of Jesus) in our first reading: "decide today whom you will serve," he insists. These are not isolated moments. From the very first chapters of the Bible we see the path of Cain and the path of Abel, the path of death and the path of life. The first psalm highlights this divergent course: "the Lord knows the way of the just, but the way of the wicked leads to ruin."

Hopefully, none of us desires to walk the path of the wicked; none of us wants to turn our back on God, I hope! But, precisely because we can so easily find ourselves on a path that leads us away from God, the Lord and those who speak for Him are compelled to draw our attention to the need to return... the need to repent. In repentance, we turn back from the path that leads away from God, recognizing it as such, and set ourselves to follow after Jesus.

The entry points to "way of the wicked" can be so subtle! We need wake-up calls to snap us out of a complacency that helps us to rationalize the sin and darkness in our lives. Thankfully, the Bible and the Church give us so many reminders of the need to follow the straight and narrow path. It is not by chance that it is Peter who proclaims the true identity of Jesus in our Gospel passage today.

The popes, Peter's successors, are the ones who continually proclaim the truths that we need to hear. Our bishops, priests, and deacons, faithfully preaching week in and week out, voice messages that are inspired by the Holy Spirit to draw us to repentance and ongoing conversion of life. The Sacraments, especially Reconciliation and the Eucharist keep us rooted in the grace of God that sustains us along the path of the just.

But it all comes down, ultimately, to our daily decisions. With all of the grace at our disposal, thanks to God's generosity, with the help of the Sacraments, and with the inspiration of God's inspired Word, we can still go astray. Fidelity is simple... not easy, but simple. We must choose, even if at great cost, those actions, words, and thoughts that we know and believe God would have us choose. We must be faithful in the small choices so that we can build up the ability, always by God's grace, of being faithful in the huge choices to come.

Luke 16:10 tells us: "The person who is trustworthy in very small matters is also trustworthy in great ones; and the person who is dishonest in very small matters is also dishonest in great ones." May

we be found worthy and trustworthy of all that

God calls us to undertake!
